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
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
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
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INTRODUCTION

This text of the Strafford inquisition for county Mayo is taken from the Royal Irish Academy manuscript 24.E. 15, which is a quarto book bound in calf with the title—'Strafford's Survey/Book of Mayo/ Manuscript '-stamped in gilt on the spine. Nothing is known of the provenance of the manuscript except that it was bought from George Petrie. 1 O'Curry's Catalogue of the Academy manuscripts describes it as being about a hundred years old, which would date it to the middle of the eighteenth century. The handwriting and paper indicate a date at the end of the seventeenth or in the first quarter of the eighteenth century. The pagination runs from two to three hundred and twenty one with a few blanks and some mistakes in the numbering which have been noted in the text. The loss of page one probably accounts for the absence of the usual adjuncts of an inquisition: the date and place of the inquiry, the names of the commissioners before whom it was taken and the names of the jurors who supplied the evidence.² Our manuscript starts baldly with the body of the inquisition. Preceding it however are twenty unnumbered pages containing a list of the proprietors arranged alphabetically, but only as to the first letter of their names.

The word 'survey' in the title of the manuscript can be misleading nowadays, because in the seventeenth century the word was used indifferently to mean either the findings of a jury or a map and its accompanying books of reference made by a surveyor. The term 'Strafford Survey' originally meant both of these things, but modern usage, confining the word 'survey' to the work of the map-maker, makes it less ambiguous to describe this manuscript as a Strafford inquisition, as the Record Commissioners did in their description of

the original manuscript in 1812.¹ The absence of the usual details which serve to identify an inquisition makes it necessary to explain how it has been possible to identify it. From its form it is obviously the findings of a jury and from its content it is the work of a jury which set out to describe in detail the ownership of land in county Mayo over the previous ten years. The usual formula runs 'that [the proprietor's name] is and for the space of 10 years before the last day of June last hath been the reputed possessor or owner of . . .' Occasionally this is varied to 'from the last day of June 1625.' No date later than 1635 occurs in the text, although in many cases of purchase and mortgage dates earlier than 1625 are given. This text must, therefore, be a copy of the inquisition which opened at Ballinrobe on 31 July 1635.

Wentworth arrived at Boyle on 9 July 1635² with a commission to find the king's title to the land of Connaught, excluding county Leitrim.³ He opened his campaign by instructing the jury, which had been carefully chosen to include the largest landowners in county Roscommon, to find the king's title as the heir of the last De Burgo earl of Ulster to all the land of the county; if they failed to find for the king then they could expect no mercy and he would take all by a process in the exchequer. Under this threat the jury found for the king and the inquiry into the reputed ownership or possession of the land of the county proceeded, the proprietors bringing in their patents to have them entered in the inquisition.⁴ Wentworth held a similar inquisition for county Sligo, at Sligo on July 20, and then moved to Ballinrobe where the inquisition for county Mayo was taken on July 31. By August 16 Wentworth was at Portumna where the jurors for county Galway refused to find the king's title and, as a result, the inquisition for that county was not held until 5 April 1637. The inquisitions for Roscommon, Sligo and Mayo were completed by December 1635 when Wentworth wrote to Sir Edward Coke 'The commissioners appointed to inquire out the number of quarters and

the several proprietors and proportions they have of lands subject to plantation in the three counties are returned . . . '1

A description of some of these Connaught inquisitions is to be found in the report of Benjamin Worsley, surveyor general and Major Miles Symner to the Commissioners of the Commonwealth for Ireland. Tune 1654: 'Of some other counties, particularly of the counties of Galway and Sligo, we find an office of inquiry made by virtue of a commission from the late king of all that were reputed proprietors of lands within each barony of the said county [sic] distinctly and what each of them claimed in possession or reversion; and what or how many towns, quarters, cartrons or other quantities or denominations of lands any or either the said particular persons held and what were the several name or names of the said land; but neither the quality or number of acres according to twenty-one foot to the perch or value of the said lands were by the said commission to be inquired after, mentioned or expressed.'2 The inquisitions were returned into chancery, were declared void by the Act of Explanation,³ remained in the Rolls Office in Dublin until their transfer to the Public Record Office of Ireland in 1864 and were destroyed there in 1922. Richard Nash and James Hardiman as sub-commissioners of the Irish Record Commission reported in 1812: 'There are also preserved here [Rolls Office the celebrated inquisitions finding the title of Charles I to the province of Connaught; they are commonly called Strafford's inquisitions having been taken before that nobleman in 1635 and 1637. They found all the land in the province and the tenants and holders thereof at the time . . . '4 Hardiman described them again in his History of Galway (Dubl. 1820): 'They are very voluminous and contain, amongst other things, the names of all the lands and principal proprietors in their several counties at the time.'

Perhaps the special advantage offered by this text of the Mayo inquisition is that it contains much the most detailed surviving account of the ownership of land in the county before any plantation was effected. It reflects the medieval pattern of ownership as it grew out of the Norman invasion, tempered by a considerable amount of recent speculation in land. Foremost among the speculators were the Galway merchants, grown rich on foreign trade, who had taken up mortgages

on the lands of the smaller proprietors to a surprising extent. Other new arrivals in Mayo, both as mortgagees and as crown tenants of monastic lands included the ubiquitous Richard Boyle, first earl of Cork. The text is arranged by baronies, there being only a single reference to a parish. All the parcels of land and their proprietors are named and the ownership of land is generally treated in greater detail than in the Book of Survey and Distribution for co. Mayo¹. Church lands, abbey lands, lands in dower, wardships, reversions, mills and fishing rights are noticed. Abbeys are mentioned and castles, even when ruined. In some cases even the rooms of a castle are entered as belonging to different people. The general picture is of a great many small freeholders and a few greater landowners.

In transcribing I have omitted regularly recurrent formulae, while retaining the first example of each in full. The words 'and that' beginning each entry in the original have been omitted in the printed text, where, instead, the entry commences with the proprietor's name followed by a dash to mark the omission of the formula ' is [or was] and for the space of ten years before the last day of June last hath been the reputed possessor or owner of.' In the case of a mortgagor, his right of redemption where it still exists is noted in the formula 'the condition of redemption of which said . . . is still in the said [proprietor's name]', which I have omitted replacing it by dash followed by a full point. In the transcription I have grouped together the references to a single proprietor where they follow each other, starting each entry on a new line, while leaving a gap between the references to different proprietors. In the text there is no such distinction of spacing. My transcription of personal and place names has followed every variation of the scribe's spelling; for the rest I have adhered to modern spelling usage. Similarly, I have re-punctuated throughout, using a semi-colon to mark a distinction between the different parcels of land. The word 'land' occurring redundantly I have silently elided, save where it is infrequent or seems to mark an antithesis with some other form of property. The land measure 'gnive' I have spelled thus in every case although such variations as 'gneeve' and 'give' occur. The land measure 'quarter' I have invariably contracted 'qr.'. Numerals are erratically written by the scribe, I have always used the arabic form, as well as substituting numerals for words whenever I thought it productive of greater clarity:

thus 'four half quarters' is rendered '4 half qrs.', 'one half qr.' is rendered ' $\frac{1}{2}$ qr.' The word 'sterling' is invariably contracted 'st.'

The British Museum manuscript Harleian 2048, a miscellaneous collection mostly relating to Ireland and not later than Charles I's reign, contains a useful ancillary document, no. 44.1 It describes itself thus (f. 445V); 'This booke containes the number of quarters of land in each barony in the countie of Mayo, with what quarters each proprietor holds, accomptinge all morgadged lands in the number of the lands of the morgadger.' It consists of a columnal list of the proprietors with the totals of their lands according to the old land measure.² A few place-names occur as proprietors' addresses. Internal division is by baronies, the sequence of baronies being the same as that of our manuscript, as, in general although not invariably, is the sequence of proprietors. At the end of the list for each barony is a list of the proprietors who hold lands in more than one barony. The total of lands ascribed to some proprietors is easily equated with the sum of the same proprietors' parcels of land in our manuscript; in others they might, perhaps, be equated with much trouble; while in others again it would almost seem to be impossible ever to equate them. The spelling of names is frequently different in the two manuscripts and the British Museum manuscript sometimes adds or drops a proprietor's father's name and at least once drops a proprietor's surname. There can be little doubt that this abstract was one of the documents prepared for Strafford's proposed plantation of co. Mayo and that it is closely related to our manuscript.3 I have used it in footnotes wherever it seemed to have something to add.

My best thanks are due to the Council of the Royal Irish Academy for their permission to publish the text and to Dr. R. Hayes, the director of the National Library of Ireland, for acquiring and making available to me the photostats of the British Museum Harleian MS. 2048. 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

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
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
