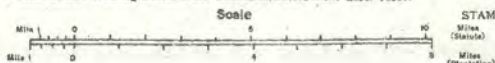

INTRODUCTION

The Civil Survey.

THE immediate circumstances leading to the taking of the Civil Survey (1654-6) were the statutory commitments of successive Parliaments, in England, in respect of advances of money, by way of adventure, and of the arrears of pay due by the Commonwealth Government to its own officers and soldiers. These obligations were to be satisfied in allotments of Irish land and, as a preliminary measure of enquiry, a survey of the country, founded upon the authentic information of the old inhabitants was directed to be made. The barony was selected as the territorial basis of the survey, as it was to be the ultimate area in which the allotments to the interests concerned were to lie. The extensive information required was of a geographical, proprietorial and economic nature and, for this purpose, the most able of the residents were to be constituted juries. These were to be empanelled by local commissioners appointed under commission.¹

In more than one of the commissions authorizing the survey, and directing the procedure to be followed, the survey to be made was distinctly named the Civil Survey. It was to be made under the jurisdiction of special courts called Courts of Survey. These Courts were to determine and record the possessions of the proprietors of lands and the tenures and titles of their respective estates. For this purpose, power was given to summon, and examine upon oath, such persons as might be considered competent to assist in the discovery of the facts; and further, to demand the production of such evidence of title as was considered necessary. Here, an analogy may be found to those courts which take cognizance of questions of fact only, arising between man and man in his civil capacity. Allowing that the Survey was made under the Civil Authorities, and also, that it was made by the people, or their most knowledgeable men, it is suggested that the Civil Survey was so called because it would be essentially a testified record of the facts concerning the possessions of the subjects, the citizens, and declared to on oath before courts appointed to ascertain such facts.

The Civil Survey was begun in June, 1654, and commissions continued to be issued during 1655 and 1656. Through the zeal and industry of the late W. H. Hardinge, Esq., M.R.I.A., its territorial extent, the names of the commissioners, and the dates of their commissions can be ascertained.² As to the extent of the Civil Survey, it comprehended the whole of Leinster, the whole of Ulster, with the exception of the barony of Farney, in the county of Monaghan; the whole of Munster, with the exception of Clare; in Connacht, only the county of Leitrim was surveyed. This represented in all a Civil Survey of twenty-seven counties. For the remaining five, the earlier survey, called Strafford's survey, was available. According to the Book of Distribution, the Gross Survey—the Survey immediately preceding the Civil Survey, was utilised for the barony of Farney.

What has survived of the Civil Survey extends to parts of three provinces, namely, for Munster—Tipperary, Limerick, Waterford, the barony of Muskerry, Co. Cork and part of one barony in Kerry; for Leinster—Dublin (except New Castle and Upper

Cross), Kildare (except Ophaley), Meath, Wexford (except Forth) and the city of Kilkenny ; for Ulster—Donegal, Londonderry and Tyrone.

From this survival of the Civil Survey, and from the Commission and Instructions which have been preserved, the functions of the commissioners, the duties of the juries, and the method of exhibiting their survey may be learned.

The functions of the Commissioners included the holding of Courts of Survey, and in having their ascertained particulars engrossed in one or more books, each barony by itself. These engrossments were to be returned, attested under the hands of three or more of the Commissioners, to the Surveyor-General and a duplicate, in like manner, fairly engrossed, attested and sealed up to the Registrar for Forfeited Lands. It appears from the list of the Commissioners for each county, that the same set operated in several counties. Thus, in Ulster, the identical Commissioners were appointed for Antrim, Armagh and Down, and likewise another similar set for Derry, Donegal and Tyrone. In the south and east the same Commissioners were appointed for Waterford and Queen's County ; and again the one set for King's County and Longford.

Before the Civil Survey was begun, it was recommended that the Commissioners to be appointed should be the Commissioners of Revenue "upon the place" or "other able and knowing men in the countrey." The names, which have been preserved, can be identified with the family names associated with the landed settlements in Ireland, for a period considerably more than fifty years prior to the Survey. In the north, particularly, the Commissioners would appear to have been proprietors of land. From time to time, new Commissioners were appointed, as the attestations to the Survey, which has survived, show. Mr. Hardinge's list is that of the original Commissioners.

The duties of the local juries were of the widest and most responsible nature. They were to be given "in charge to inquire and find out all and every the particulars" required to be ascertained. They were, when necessary, "to view and tread the meets and bounds of the premises, and to forme all such other matters and things as are perfectly inquirable in courts of survey . . ." These juries were composed—as was indeed attested¹—of "the most able and ancient Inhabitants of the country." Their names have survived for all the baronies of two counties—Tipperary and Limerick. It is possible to identify some of these jurors as proprietors, and it would not be an unreasonable conjecture to assume, in most cases, that they were relatives of proprietors—brothers or elder sons. The juries for corporate towns appear to have been composed of the mayor, aldermen and burgesses, together with representatives of the professional and business interests. Additional jurors were added as assistants by special order. The name of the clerk appointed by two of the Limerick juries is given, at the end of the lists of jurors for the barony of Pobblebrien and of the Liberties of Limerick.

Distinct juries were appointed for each barony and were selected as stated, for their special knowledge of the territories within which they resided. The number comprising each jury varied. In Limerick they ranged from twenty-four to forty-five for each barony ; in Tipperary, from ten to twenty-three. For the distinct

surveys to be made of Crown and Church lands the same jurors, in the latter county, were appointed.

The survey of each barony opens with a description of its meares and bounds, and, frequently, with an exposition of the nature of its soil. Its content according to the old land measure is set down, and the description concludes with an account of the parishes, manors and castles within the barony.¹ The boundaries of the parish follow, and at the end of each description, in the Tipperary text, there is a statement as to the value of the tithes. The lands comprising the parish, their owners, estimated area, what was profitable and unprofitable, and the respective valuations are then set out in tabular form, intersected by further descriptive particulars relating to the tenures or titles under which each denomination was held. Here the ancestral tenures of the Gael, and the Norman, existing in 1640, are exhibited and recorded, as well as titles "by patent from the Crowne."

Instances of the former will be found in the barony of Ikerrin, within the text of volume one. There, the whole parish of Killea is shown to have been individually and "moyetively" distributed between numerous proprietors "all descended out of the house of O'Magher whose title they clayme (viz.) by fee from their ancestors." It is recorded of each that he was the proprietor of the fractional proportion specified by descent from his ancestors. These inherited divisions, the meares of which could "by no way be set forth distinctly" represented, doubtless, the shares to which the proprietors were entitled, individually, in the productivity of the soil. Whether the division was in pursuance of a Brehon decree, or family arrangement, is not recorded. But there is extant for certain lands in the neighbouring barony of Lower Ormond a copy of Brehon judgment, dated 8th October, 1584, regulating the tenures thereof, and which directs "an honest, equal, brotherly division with each other according to the custom of their ancestors."²

In addition to the tenures, the description of the lands includes an account of their amenities. The area under timber, its distance from the nearest port, the presence of mills, and the varying succulence of rivers and streams, according to the season of the year, are amongst the particulars recorded* in this section of the Civil Survey. And so, until every parish in the barony was completed.

Thus emerged the "old inhabitants" survey of their country, of its place-names, rendered phonetically into English of the time, of its ancient tenures, of its land measures and territorial divisions. It extended far beyond the discovery of forfeited lands, Crown lands, Church lands, the lands of the English and of Protestant lands—their owners and estimated areas. It revealed and preserved the memory of the ancient bounds, place-names, and antiquities of three provinces. It comprehended the detection of the wealth and valuation of the country, in every form under and above the surface of the land. The Civil Survey is not limited to defining the boundaries of forfeited lands; it records the boundaries of baronies "and the course that

the said meets and bounds doe runne." It gives independent dealings with lands, transfers by sale, bequests by testament, mortgages, and marriage settlements. It is a description of the physical features of the land from the highest to the lowest denominations—a geography of its mountains, its high roads, its rivers and streamlets, and simultaneously a record of the ownership and title to the lands which these natural boundaries surrounded or divided.

The purpose of the survey has been stated by Mr. Hardinge: "Many persons are under an impression that the Civil Survey was designed as the basis of the satisfactions afterwards made to the soldiers for arrears of pay due to them, and that it was rejected by the Government in consequence of complaints of its inaccuracy. Such an impression is altogether erroneous. This survey was not designed for the purpose assumed. It was a preliminary work, essential to the discovery and description in a legitimate and solemn manner of the forfeited lands, and from which lists technically called 'terriers' were afterwards supplied to the several surveyors for their admeasurement and mapping.

"It was by these maps, and their index sheets, when approved by the Surveyor-General, and sanctioned by Government, and not by the Civil Survey, that the land satisfactions were made to the soldiers and adventurers, as well as to the other interests afterwards let in by the Acts of Settlement and Explanation."

In the indexing of each barony, a uniform method was adopted throughout. The proprietors were distinguished by separate indexes, that of the English usually coming first, and the Irish next. An index of the lands followed¹ these, and then an index of "Observations."² The place-names, however, in the barony and parish descriptions were not indexed; nor were the personal names referred to in the descriptive particulars relating to the title to lands by descent, through patent or conveyance. A full index will be forthcoming with the complete publication of the text for each county.

The pagination, in one respect, was also uniform. Each page was numbered at the top of the right-hand corner, and the index was based on this pagination. In some baronies, however, there is recorded a second pagination, on alternate pages. It occurs either at the bottom or side of the page, and suggests a reference to the folios in which the first entries may have been made.

As directed, a number of the Commissioners, usually three, attested or certified the survey of each barony. Their names appear at the end, appended to statements certifying how and when the Survey was made. A statement as to the holding of the Courts of Survey, followed by the names of the jurors, precedes the description of each barony in Tipperary. The names of the Limerick jurors, "sworn and empanelled to enquire and return an exact Survey" appear after those of the Commissioners at the end of the baronies. The jurors for County Dublin are described as "the most knowing and sufficient men," though their names are not returned. The jurors for Waterford though not specified, are described as "the most able and ancient inhabitants of the country." The northern Commissioners certified that the Survey was taken by them, and recorded the date.

When completed, the Civil Survey was to be forwarded to the Surveyor-General, and a duplicate sent to the Registrar for Forfeited Lands. The former set, according to Mr. Hardinge, unquestionably reached its destination. He refers to the statement of Surveyor-General Stone that it was consumed in the fire of 1711. "This statement implies," says Mr. Hardinge, "that the set was complete, and in this office when the fire occurred, but the statement is inaccurate. A large portion of the set had been removed from the Surveyor-General's office . . . before the close of the year 1667—and was not afterwards restored." He then refers to the discovery, in 1817, by the Irish Record Commissioners, of eighty-four "original Civil Survey Barony Books" in the library of Viscount Headfort at Kells, County Meath.

The subsequent history of these books is related in the Statement (see page xliii) of Mr. M. J. McEnery, M.R.I.A., Deputy Keeper of Records, and Keeper of State Papers, 1914-1921. Acquired by the Commissioners of Woods, Forests and Land Revenues, they were deposited in the Quit Rent Office, and ultimately transferred to the Public Record Office. Mr. McEnery points out the importance of this addition to the latter office, where it was available for public inspection. Copies of the volumes were then supplied by the Record Office to the Quit Rent Office. A separate statement shows the counties and baronies which these represent (see page xlv). With other documents from the Quit Rent Office collection these copies have now been lodged in the Public Record Office.

As to the duplicate of Civil Survey barony books, destined for the office of the Registrar of Forfeited Lands, Mr. Hardinge says: "The set of barony books, which must be presumed to have reached the office of Registrar of Forfeitures, should have been transferred to the Auditor-General, as the other records of that office were, under the 60th section of the Instructions annexed to the Act of Settlement, about the year 1678; but there exists no evidence whatever from which to infer such a transfer; and I am of opinion that this set of barony books were appropriated antecedently to that year by some person officially, or otherwise, closely connected with the Office of Registrar of Forfeitures; and that at this moment they are reposing in some private library"

The hope expressed in 1862 by Mr. Hardinge, that the publication of his Memoir, on the Manuscript and other Surveys of Ireland, would evoke inquiry, especially in England, may now be renewed.

The legal framework within which the Civil Survey was begun and completed will now be referred to briefly.

The source of authority for the taking of the Civil Survey, resides in that code of English Acts and Ordinances—passed between the years 1642 and 1653, contemporaneous with the wars begun in Ireland towards the close of 1641. A survey of forfeited lands was contemplated from the outset, and the opening Act of the code prescribed the measure to be taken when the English Parliament should declare the existence of conditions which would permit of the survey being made.¹ By an Act passed in August, 1652, it was declared that a position had been reached when a settlement of the Irish nation might be effected.² "Early in 1653, when the Commis-

sioners of the Parliament of England, for the affairs of Ireland, felt themselves in a condition to proceed with a survey of the forfeited lands, they had, as a necessary preliminary, to decide upon the manner of its execution. The ancient modes known in law were two :—1st, by inquisition out of the Chancery or Exchequer, after the precedents of the surveys of the Desmond forfeitures ; 2nd, by commission under the great seal, after the precedent set by James I. in the survey of the six escheated counties. The latter mode was adopted."¹ On the 22nd June, 1653, a Commission, with Instructions, under the Great Seal of England² was addressed to Charles Fleetwood, Esq., Lieutenant-General of the Army in Ireland, Edmund Ludlow, Esq., Lieutenant-General of the Horse, Miles Corbet, Esq., and John Jones.³ It constituted them Commissioners for putting in execution the instructions, thereto attached, for a perfect survey and admeasurement of various classifications of lands. They were authorised to appoint Surveyor-Generals, and "Surveyors under them," and "to constitute a fit person of integrity for the Office of Registrar." This Commission, with Instructions, was ratified and confirmed by the Act for the "Satisfaction of Adventurers and Soldiers" passed on the 26th September, 1653."⁴

The Instructions, accompanying this Commission, prescribed the procedure to be followed, and the personnel to be employed in the three surveys directed to be taken—namely, a survey by inquisition, a survey by admeasurement, and what was called a "Gross Survey." Under-Surveyors, to be appointed by the Surveyors-General, were directed to "enquire and find out" the landed interests of the inhabitants, and also, what were Crown lands and Church lands ; for this purpose they were empowered to hold Courts of Survey. For the survey by admeasurement "persons skilled in the art of surveying" were to be appointed, subject to the approval of the Commissioners, under the warrant of the Surveyors-General.

On the grounds of the utmost urgency, the "Gross Survey" though the last to be named, was directed to be made first, irrespective of what the instructions provided, as to the other surveys. Commissions for this survey were issued, simultaneously, in August, 1653, to the public officers acting as commissioners of revenue, within the fifteen precincts into which the country had been divided. So unsatisfactory, however, were the returns from the Gross Survey,⁵ that official directions were given for the taking of abstracts from the Strafford surveys, and such "other papers, returns, or county books," as were available. The Gross Survey continued, however, until the following year, when it was suddenly stopped.⁶ Then, by an Order, dated the 14th April, 1654, addressed to the Surveyor-General, Benjamin Worsley, Esq., the other

surveys, authorised by the Commission, with Instructions, of 22nd June, 1653, were directed to be begun.¹

The initial proceeding under this Order would appear to have been the consideration of the instructions to be issued for the making of the Civil Survey, and the Survey by admeasurement. A Committee was appointed for the purpose, by the General Council of Officers, and it reported on the 11th May, 1654.² This report was mainly concerned with the principles and the methods to be adopted and followed in the admeasurement of estates and their surrounds. As to the Civil Survey, the procedure had been already fully indicated by the Instructions of June, 1653, and the Committee then added nothing to these save a recommendation on the subject of the Courts of Survey. For "their better performance," the Committee advised that the instructions to be issued should be directed to the "Commissioners of Revenue upon the place" or "other able and knowing men in the country." Whether by virtue of this recommendation or not, Commissions, with Instructions, began to be addressed, in the following month, to sets of Commissioners for each county in Ireland, excepting the counties of Clare, Galway, Mayo, Roscommon and Sligo. With regard to these counties "the Strafford survey, then extant, contained as specific an account of the lands, their proprietors and possessors, as any new work of the kind could do."³

The sequence in which the Commissions, with Instructions, were sent to the local Commissioners was based on the priority of the appropriations of the counties of Ireland specified in the Act of Satisfaction of September, 1653. Ten counties, in the first place, were set aside for the satisfaction of the Adventurers and Soldiers, and the earliest Commissions, with Instructions, were issued in respect of these counties. Fortunately, specimens have been preserved and are reproduced (see page xxxvii). It is from the examination of these that the magnitude of the Civil Survey will be learned.

Within this legal framework, the Civil Survey was begun. The last date of which there is any record for the issue of a Commission is the 1st September, 1656, for county Monaghan. Eighteen Commissions were issued in 1654, covering the same number of counties. There is strong evidence to support the opinion that the survey of these was completed before the summer of 1655, and a statement by Mr. Hardinge on this point will be quoted presently. Two-thirds of the work would, therefore have been completed in about twelve months. For the remaining nine counties, seven Commissions were issued between 1655 and 1656; the Commissions for two counties—Cavan and Fermanagh, have not been found. While no definite date can be assigned for the completion of the Civil Survey, the year 1656 may be said to have witnessed the issue of the final Commissions under which its far-reaching enquiries were made.

It has already been stated that in more than one of the Commissions, the Surveys to be taken were distinctly named "The Civil Survey,"⁴ This is the specific and official appellation. Mapped admeasurements, contemporaneous with the Civil Survey, were at times also brought within this designation. "It was the unsatisfactory nature

of the survey taken under this Order—the so-called Civil Survey—which led Petty to offer to undertake a more exact admeasurement of the forfeited lands in Ireland.”¹ This Order has been previously noticed. It was the Order dated 14th April, 1654, which, on the failure of the Gross Survey, directed the taking of the other surveys authorized in June, 1653. In pursuance of this Order, and by virtue of the Act of September, 1653, two distinct sets of instructions were issued; one to the local Commissioners, for the taking of the Civil Survey, and the other, some time later, to the surveyors who were to admeasure the forfeited lands according to certain rules. The Report of the Committee appointed “to consider the business of the Surveys,” dated September 24th, 1654, clearly shows that it was the considered inadequacy of these rules that led to Petty’s proposals “for a more exact admeasurement.”² The Civil Survey had been placed in other hands four months previously, and proceeded to a conclusion, in the manner first appointed, as what has survived of it definitely attests. Neither in authorship nor correction can Petty be identified distinctly with it. Rather his total dependence on the Civil Survey is a distinguishing feature of its history.

The Instructions to the Local Commissioners directed that out of the surveys taken, abstracts containing the names of lands, and their boundaries, should be delivered to those authorized to make the admeasurements. Petty’s contract of the 11th December, 1654, left this procedure undisturbed.³ But time was the essence of this contract, so far as Dr. Petty was concerned. He had contracted to perform the work of admeasurement “within one year and one month next” after the date of his agreement. Immediately pressure began to be employed for one return or another. On the 20th December, it was ordered “that all commissioners which are employed in the civil survey do take care with all speed to furnish Dr. Petty or his assigns, with the abstracts of all the forfeited lands in each county and barony . . . to the end the said Dr. may be directed unto all and every of the said lands to be surveyed by him.”⁴ On the 25th December, the “Committee touching the manner of Surveys” requested the Lord Deputy to obtain from the Committee “for the Civil Survey” an estimate of all the forfeited lands both profitable and unprofitable.⁵ On the 12th February following a further Order was issued: “Ordered, that it be referred to the committee for removing obstructions in the surveys undertaken by Dr. Petty, to meet . . . and consider of the proceedings of the commissioners for the civil survey, and how the concealments of lands may be remedied, how far the present surveys may be of use, and what course is to be taken for having true and full civil surveys returned to remain of record for public use. And they are to treat with the commissioners-general concerning abstracts to be given of the civil survey.”⁶ The explanation of the urgency that had arisen is manifest from Dr. Petty’s “Humble Remonstrance concerning his extraordinary Grievances.”⁷

"And first," he complained, "your petitioner sheweth that through the backwardness of the Civil Survey, and want of abstracts, he was exceedingly damnified. At first, that having none at all ready at the first sealing of his contract hee, notwithstanding, out of zeale to promote the service sett out sixty instruments to enquire of the country, which proved soe confused, as that the whole charge of what was done untill the latter end of February was wholly lost." That Dr. Petty required more than abstracts is evident from the continued expression of his grievances, thus :

"Ffor want of the bookes of the Civil Survey your petitioner hath been often put to the trouble and charge of two or three admeasurements instead of one." And, finally, he complained : "Your petitioner after long sollicitation finding noe hopes of having the civil survey of the countyes of Carlow and Wicklow, hath notwithstanding adventured to survey and measure them . . . to the end of the season for doeing the same might not slipp and bee lost, to the prejudice of the Commonwealth and the Army." In whatever quarter the delay may have rested, it can scarcely be ascribed to those charged with the taking and attesting of the Civil Survey. That, for the County Tipperary, for example, was completed, with the exception of two baronies, before the end of October, 1654, two months before the signing of Dr. Petty's contract. This will be seen from the separate statement on this county (see Vol. I., page xi). According to Mr. Hardinge, who had all the records at his disposal, "the Civil Survey of most of the baronies included within the said articles (Petty's agreement) was returned . . . before March 1655, and many of them before the date of Petty's articles of undertaking ; so that no impediment interposed to prevent his making an immediate commencement of the admeasurement and mapping work." This certainly clears the jurors and local commissioners. It may be pointed out, however, that the Civil Survey was required for another purpose at this time. In the same month that Dr. Petty's agreement was made—December, 1654—Commissioners commonly called the Athlone Commissioners, were appointed in connection with the Transplantation proceedings. "As the whole nation was declared guilty of rebellion it lay on each claimant to prove the extent and nature of his estate. To check the claimants the Commissioners were furnished with, amongst other books, the Civil Survey."¹

Whatever may have been the cause of the "backwardness" of which Dr. Petty complained, his "grievances" may be interpreted, perhaps, as being amongst the earliest tributes to the Civil Survey. It is to be apprehended, however, that if some of the surveys were to prove less informative in descriptive detail than others, the deficiency was to be related to the pressure residential either in Petty's contractual obligations for the performance of his own survey, or in the requirements of "The Court of the Commissioners for the Claims and Qualifications of the Irish."

The Civil Survey of County Dublin.

THE CIVIL Survey of County Dublin was made under the authority of a Commission with Instructions dated 4th October, 1654.¹ Though the Commission and Instructions are not available, specimens of those issued for another county are printed with this volume (p. xxxvii). Some particulars of the original Dublin Commission, as to the names of the Commissioners, the baronies to be surveyed, the date of the Commission and Instructions, have been preserved by Hardinge in his paper on *Surveys in Ireland 1640-88*.² According to this authority, the Civil Survey of the following Dublin baronies was directed to be made: Balruddery, Castleknock, Coolock, Nethercross, Newcastle and Uppercross, and Rathdown. With the exception of that for Newcastle and Uppercross, the present volume contains the text for the remaining baronies. Though the Civil Survey of Newcastle and Uppercross is not available, evidence that it was duly made is afforded by the Dublin Book of Survey and Distribution, compiled after the Restoration.³ Particulars, however, of proprietorship within these regions, as at the year 1641, with descriptions of barony and parish boundaries compiled from sources, later to be explained, form the subjects of Appendices A and B (pp. 285-308). With regard to Dublin city and Liberties, it is apparent from the Appendix (E) to Hardinge's paper that he could not find any Commission directing a Civil Survey to be taken of these areas.⁴

The distinct Civil Survey made of each of the baronies, included in this volume, was attested, in accordance with their instructions, by the Commissioners appointed to hold Courts of Survey throughout the baronies constituting the county; their Certificates of a uniform nature, each reciting the authority conferred by the Commission of October, 1654, appear at the end of the respective baronial texts, after the indexes. All these Certificates are dated from "Patrick's Close, Dublin, third November, 1655," each being signed by the same set of Commissioners: "John Tuttell, Tho. Tresham and Jo. Rawline." Two of these fall within the description "and others" given by Hardinge in his list of the Commissioners appointed for the Dublin Civil Survey: "Thomas Hook, Isaac Dobson, Robert Doyly, John Tuttle and others." The names of the jurors, it is regretted, have not been preserved. From the dates of the Commission and of the foregoing Certificates it is to be inferred that the requirements of Government for the taking of the Dublin Survey had been completed in approximately twelve months, and that the transmission of one set to the Surveyor-General and of the duplicate to the Registrar of Forfeited Lands followed immediately.

The Commissioners, while testifying to the endeavour made "to find out," *inter alia*, the lands of the respective baronies and their value in the year 1640, by juries of the "most knowing and sufficient men," recorded in each Certificate their disagreement with the returns made as to the valuation for the year stated. It will be noted, from the specimen Instructions, printed with this volume, that those who were entrusted with the Survey were "to inquire and find out the true yearly value of the premises . . . as the same were let for, or worth to be let, in the year 1640 or at any time before."

In regard to the valuation that was made, the Commissioners state that the juries were not so "wary in that particular" fearing that the "contributions" to be imposed would be in proportion thereto; they add that they themselves, had viewed several of the lands and found them to have been worth as valued by them. This is the explanation of the dual valuation, each being clearly distinguished, appearing throughout the entire text in respect of most of the lands of every barony.

Reference to the text of Rathdown (pp. 257-84), the only barony of south Dublin for which the Civil Survey is available, will show that the revised valuation was frequently twice, and in one instance, more than three times that of the jury.⁶ This variation is most evident where the jurors total valuations of distinct denominations is expressive of rating at 2/-, 4/- or 6/- per acre. It will be observed, however, that the Commissioners and Jurors occasionally agreed, particularly in regard to lands in the northern baronies of the county. Within Nethercross and Balrothery the valuation of the Juries, in some instances examined, correspond with a rating of 8/-, 10/- and 16/- per acre, rates with which the Commissioners intimated their concurrence.

It is to be enquired, however, to what extent either valuation was influenced by evidence derived from leaseholders or documentary sources as to the actual rents for which lands were let in 1640; the Instructions it will be recalled comprehended an alternative valuation based on what it was considered the lands were worth to be let in 1640 or earlier. The tenor of the Commissioners' statements induces the interpretation that their valuation was determined by considerations of worth alone, as at the year—1640.

Already, by the Adventurers' Act of 1642⁷, and by the Commonwealth Act of Settlement (A.D. 1653),⁸ lands in Ireland had been assigned, for the satisfaction of the claims of Soldiers and Adventurers, at specified rates per acre; in Leinster it was 12/-. Next, therefore, to the discovery of lands liable to confiscation, no other investigation would be, it is thought, the subject of more penetrating supervision than the valuation of such lands.⁹ In this connection it may be suggested that the Civil Survey presented a retrospective valuation of the country related to the landed settlement projected under the Acts 1642-1653, rather than to the requirements of "contributions" or

taxation.⁹ Soon indeed after the issue of the Civil Survey Commission, it was reported to the Lord Protector Cromwell by the Lord Deputy and Council that they had lately received information of the "value" of certain baronies and of their "goodness, largeness and commodious situation."¹⁰ These were the baronies in Dublin and Cork which had been allocated for the satisfaction of the claims of maimed soldiers and widows and orphans at the same rates per acre as those allowed for the Adventurers and Soldiers. The barony of Castleknock is specially set apart for this purpose by the Commonwealth Act of Settlement of 1653, while those of Coolock and Balrothery are mentioned in subsequent documents.¹¹ In the report to Cromwell, however, it was recommended that in view of the poverty of the persons concerned they could not be expected to effect a satisfactory plantation, and it was recommended that the baronies should be sold for "ready money," the claimants to be compensated in cash. Dublin, it may be recalled, had been specially reserved, with Carlow, Kildare and Cork, under the Act of 1653, to the Commonwealth Government for its own use, subject to grants of land already made, or such dispositions as in the instance just mentioned.¹² For the purpose of the creation of a new English Pale, Dublin also formed part of the territory known, at the date of the Civil Survey, as the Five Counties¹³; it was proposed that from this region which ultimately included Dublin county, south of the Liffey,¹⁴ Wicklow, Wexford, Carlow and Kildare, all "Irish Papists" without exception should be removed before the 1st May, 1655.¹⁵

In conjunction with the unusual feature of a dual valuation may be noted the series of statistical abstracts appearing at the end of each baronial text. Here are summarised for each parish in the barony the number of acres belonging to "Irish Papists," to English Protestants, and those comprising Church lands. These tables are preceded by a General Abstract showing, for each parish, the division of land under the following heads: Arable land; Meadow, Pasture & Furze; Mountain and Unprofitable Land. With this Abstract will be read the descriptive matter introducing each baronial section; thus, at Balrothery barony (p. 3) it is reported that "the soil . . . is for the most part Rye and Meslin land and the rest wheat land." The estimated area of the barony is given as 21,607 acres of which 14,503 acres are returned as "Arable" land, 3983 acres as "Meadow and Pasture" and 3121 acres "unprofitable."

It may here be explained that the areas of lands to be viewed and surveyed, for the purpose of the Civil Survey, were directed to be estimated according to "one and twenty foot to the perch, and one hundred and sixty perches to the acre."¹⁶ Admeasurement "with the chain and instrument" was reserved for the later Survey,

known as the Down Survey, and which, likewise, was directed to express the perch as containing twenty-one feet.¹⁷ This content of the perch is said to have been the distinguishing feature of Irish Plantation Measure.¹⁸ It may be mentioned that collation of both Surveys, in regard to similar lands, showed that the areas *estimated*, in the instances examined, were less than those admeasured by from two to twenty acres. In Balrothery barony the respective surveys were occasionally within an acre of each other; but elsewhere in the county, particularly in the barony of Rathdown, the admeasured areas of the Down Survey were found to be considerably greater than those returned by the Civil Survey.

With the exception of details as to the value of Tithes and related matter regarding title to possession thereof, to which further reference will be made, the Dublin Civil Survey furnishes the particulars directed to be found and in the format prescribed. The descriptive and explanatory matter provides the boundaries of baronies, parishes and denominations of land; it also includes an account of various lands constituting manors and the feudal obligations attached thereto of rendering suit and service at the lord's court; the proprietor's title, invariably described as by inheritance, with the notable exception (p. 169) of the lord of Howth—deriving "under letters patent granted by King Henry the Second," is here also given; likewise, existing buildings, mansion houses, mills and cottages, are specified and valued under each denomination or townland.

In the specification of proprietorship, "Protestant Lands" and "Church Lands" are distinguished for the most part, in sections so headed, within each parish, the lands of "Irish Papists" being first detailed. The pagination of each barony is distinct and the textual indexes are based on the classification indicated both in respect of proprietors and lands. These indexes, however, do not include the names of persons or lands mentioned in the descriptive sections of the text; they are confined to the names of proprietors appearing in the first column and to the lands specified in the second column of the scheduled returns. Even in these connections care must be exercised in their use. In the instance, for example, of Lord Fitzwilliam, returned as the proprietor of a farm in Keppuck, situated in the parish and barony of Castleknock (p. 246) neither owner nor place is indexed. An effort has been made to rectify such errors, where observed, the names and figures appearing within square brackets indicating the correct references.

Alternative sources are provided in Appendices A and B for the missing Civil Survey of the baronies of Newcastle and Uppercross. These represent respectively (1) excerpts relating to barony and parish boundaries, derived from the "Books of Reference" accompanying the Dublin Down Survey Maps (A.D. 1655-56), and (2) extracts specifying names of proprietors and lands, as at the year 1641, taken from the Dublin Book of Survey and Distribution, formerly in official use in the Quit Rent

Office, and now lodged in the Public Record Office. The collection of Down Survey maps in the private keeping of Messrs. S. S. and E. Reeves, Solicitors, Dublin, was examined some years ago by Mr. Charles McNeill, whose report is printed in *Analecta Hibernica* No. 8 (1938). Since then, through the courtesy of Messrs. Reeves, the entire set, representing copies of the official maps and "Books of Reference" which had survived the fire of 1711, was kindly loaned to the National Library, Dublin, for photographing. It is from this source that Appendix A has been drawn.

In Larcom's edition of Petty's *History of the Down Survey* (p. 36) will be found the detailed instructions, dated 12th April, 1655, given to Dr. (later Sir) Wm. Petty by the Surveyor-General (Worsley) for the compilation of the "Books of Reference." The object to be achieved was a "clear and distinct knowledge of the quantity of forfeited profitable lands and other lands belonging to the Commonwealth in each barony." For this purpose it was required, *inter alia*, that the number in the plot or map of the denomination surveyed should be entered in the first column, in the next the proprietor's name, and, in succeeding columns the names of the denominations of land and the admeasured areas, distinguishing profitable from unprofitable, and again distinguishing profitable into meadow, arable and pasture. Each "Book of Reference" was also to contain a description of "the barony by its meets and bounds, by the Soil and by the nature of the Soil in general; by the rivers rising out of it, running through it, or meeting in it; by the several cities, towns, passes or other things of eminency or note relating or belonging to it."

In the volume of Down Survey maps for Dublin, bearing a copy of Petty's certificate¹⁹, there is for each barony of the county this "Book of Reference" expressing the foregoing particulars. Parish boundaries are also given with a description of the soil; likewise the names of the forfeited denominations within each parish, these particulars concluding with brief references to existing "Improvements" in the nature of mills, bridges, castles and so forth.

It is these particulars, only, which have been copied in Appendix A, from the "Books of Reference," in substitution for the information not available by the loss of the Civil Survey. The other facts, also attested by Petty, as to names of proprietors, and forfeited lands, were at a later date embodied in the Dublin Book of Survey and Distribution. Since the latter included unforfeited lands, particulars of which were drawn from the Civil Survey, it was considered to be the more comprehensive and satisfactory source for the full particulars of proprietors and lands within the two baronies. Appendix B, therefore, represents extracts from the Book of Survey and Distribution.

It may be recalled in connection with the origin of this latter source that in pursuance of certain clauses (Sections 6 and 46) of the Act of Settlement (14 & 15 Chas. II) Books were directed to be compiled from the surveys "of the late pretended powers"—

the Civil Survey and the Down Survey, expressing the names of proprietors in 1641, of townlands, quarters or other denominations, the persons to whom these were assigned and the admeasured areas. In the 46th section of the Act, these books are called the "Books of Survey and Distribution." They also include Church lands which are invariably indicated, when belonging to an archbishopric or bishopric by a symbol in the first column—a cross surmounting the letters *AB* or *B* amplified in the next column by the statement "Bishopslands," or, in the present context the title of the owner—the Archbishop of Dublin.

Only what the Dublin Book of S. & D. specifies in regard to proprietorship in the year 1641 has been abstracted for the purpose of Appendix B.

The foregoing texts do not entirely distinguish the barony of Uppercross and the barony of Newcastle. Particulars which they contain are furnished under the titles of the "barony of Newcastle and Uppercross" and the "barony of Uppercross." These units would appear to have been creations of the Down Survey cartographers occasioned most likely by the difficulty of mapping satisfactorily the detached and scattered localities comprising the barony of Uppercross. The origin of this barony and the areas constituting it will be referred to at a later stage.

An index to Appendices A and B is provided by Appendix C (p. 309).

Various matters, throughout the text, call for a note of explanation, but before adverting to these it may be said that an interesting feature of the Dublin Civil Survey is the account given of the conduct and activities of numerous proprietors during the wars begun in 1641. The nature of the information furnished may be illustrated by some examples: Bartholomew Russell, Irish Papist, "left his house at Seatowne after the defeat given to the Irish at Swodes, and died about the beginning of the first cessation with the rebels in the county of Louth" (p. 102); George Blackney [Blakney] of Rickenhore "deserted his house in the beginning of the Rebellion and lived with his brother-in-law Colonel Bagenall a Rebel in the county of Carlow (pp. 101-2); James Bath of Drumcondra "stands indicted of Rebellion (p. 178); William Plunkett of Portmarnock "is indicted of rebellion" (p. 174); Robert Plunkett of Rathmore is "indicted for adhering to the rebels" (p. 273); John Harrold of Kilmakeog [Kilmashogue] "acted in the Irish Army as Cornett of a Troop of horse" (p. 272); James Goodman of Loughanstown "who was put to death for rebelling . . . acted in the Irish Army as Provost Marshal" (pp. 268-9). Other instances of the information furnished in this connection could be cited but sufficient perhaps, has been indicated to guide the investigator.

Particular features of other returns may now be noticed.

In reserving to its own use Church lands and tithes, the Commonwealth Government directed that these were to be carefully distinguished and set apart in each county and barony²⁰; they were not to be distributed to adventurers and soldiers like other forfeited lands and rents.²¹

In the present text, as already indicated, certain lands where they occur in a particular parish are distinguished by captions signifying either "Bishops and other Church land" or simply "Church lands in the Parish." The proprietors, in 1641, of

such lands included the Lord Archbishop of Dublin, described either as an "English Protestant" or "Protestant"—by right of "his Hierarchy" or "his Bishopric," the Dean of Christ Church—"in right of his Deanery," the Dean and Chapter of Christ Church, the Chancellor of Christ Church—"as belonging to that Dignitary," the Dean, Dean and Chapter of St. Patrick's Cathedral, the "Treasurer and Chanter" of St. Patrick's, the Petty Canons and Vicars Choral of the same Cathedral. In regard to lands, tithes, or rents, whatever the possession or interest might be, there are distinct specifications of ownership in each of the foregoing instances:

Where it was considered that there had been improper classification of lands, the text itself occasionally directs attention to the matter. For example, lands in Finglas parish, recorded as held by Sir Edward Bagshaw from the Archbishop of Dublin, under a long lease, are set out in the section reserved for "Protestant Lands" (p. 142). A textual observation directs as follows: "This to be returned amongst Church Lands." In the same parish and section lands held by lease from St. Sith's Guild²² are similarly directed to be returned with the Church lands (p. 143). Other instances will be found in the parishes of Lusk (p. 117) and of Swords (p. 94). The text, evidencing close scrutiny, before certification, likewise notes the incorrect return of "Protestant" lands in the section reserved for Church lands (p. 148).

The type of information afforded in regard to leases of Church property may be instanced: Alderman William Gough of Dublin held "Bathsfarme" by lease from the Lord Archbishop of Dublin; "Barbara the relict of the said William by her last will and testament left the said lands unto Luke Bath and John Gough her sons" (p. 108); "Old Court" and "Churches farme" in Finglas were held by Elizabeth Barlow "now the wife of Mr. Robert Kennedy English Protestant" by lease from the Archbishop (p. 140); St. Dolough's, and other lands, were held by lease from the Dean and Chapter of Christ Church by Christopher Fagan at the yearly rent of £1 : 6 : 0 (p. 189). "Saint Patrick's Acre" with the tithes of "Battle Park in Swords" were in the possession of John Hawkshaw by lease, "for many years to come," from the Vicar's Choral of St. Patrick's Cathedral (p. 106).

While within the distinct returns of Church Lands the facts are specified as to proprietors and leaseholders, all other sections of the text must be consulted for particulars of ecclesiastical incomes derived under fee-farm grants or long leases; "George Blackney [Blakney-Blakeney] Irish Papist, "held Rickenhore in fee-farm from the Archbishop of Dublin "paying for the same to the said Archbishop and his successors, the yearly chief rent of six pounds Irish or four pounds ten shillings sterling" (p. 102); John Harold of Kilmakeog [Kilmashogue], "Irish Papist," proprietor of the same place "had a fee farme from the Dean of Christ Church" (p. 272); Robert Chamberlain of Kilrusk, "Irish Papist," held Kilrusk as his inheritance "and pays a chief rent of three pounds, ten shillings to the Archbishop (p. 211).

Thus emerges, in detail, particulars of Church lands, as at the year 1641, which were then either in the possession of ecclesiastical persons, or their lessees, or which had been alienated.

The manorial jurisdiction of the Archbishop of Dublin, indicated at the barony of Nethercross (pp. 85-163), will be the subject of a separate note, at a later stage; likewise the returns as to tithes which are not distinguished by any particular classification, their ownership ecclesiastical, and lay, being very briefly specified under denominations of land throughout the text, or occasionally, in the course of parish boundary descriptions.

Statements appearing at various items indicating that the ecclesiastical proprietorship recorded of certain Church lands, and revenues, had been superseded by that of Trinity College, call for explanation. The manner in which this is given expression, in regard to different interests, may first be illustrated by some examples:

"The premises [Great Lyssenhall] do suit and service to the Court held by the College at Swordes formerly held by the Archbishop" (p. 109).

Under numerous denominations of land in the barony of Nethercross the foregoing statement or its substance is repeated. Again, at Uppercross barony (p. 296) the denomination of Ballymore is described as "Bishops land given by his Highness to Dublin Colledge"; likewise in respect of premises in the parish of Portraine (p. 149). Reiterated expression is given to this new ownership in regard to tithes: "The tythes belonged to the Deane and Chapter of St. Patricks Dublin and now to the College" (p. 112). Throughout the barony of Nethercross the various dignitaries of the Cathedral entitled to revenue from this source are usually distinguished: "The tythes belonged to the Vicars Choralls of St. Patricks Dublin (let by them to John Hawkshaw who now possesseth the same) who held the same from the Deane and Chapter . . . which doe belong to the Colledge" (p. 115). Occasionally the College is returned without reference to previous ownership it being stated, as at the parish of "the Ward" (p. 233), that the tithes belonged to it, and no more.²³

Nowhere in the Civil Survey is reference made to the authority for the sequestration thus indicated. It will be found, however, in an Act of the Parliament of England, dated 8 March 1649/50 entitled "*An Act for the better Advancement of the Gospel and Learning in Ireland.*"²⁴ This Act ordained that all "honors, castles, lordships, manors, lands, revenues, rents and profits" which hitherto had belonged (1) "unto the late Archbishop of Dublin" and (2) "unto the late Dean, Dean and Chapter of St. Patrick's in Ireland" should be and were thereby settled, established, and vested, together with certain lands of the Bishop of Meath, in the trustees mentioned "their heirs and assigns for ever" in trust for "the settling and maintenance of the College now in or near the city of Dublin, commonly called Trinity College." The twelve trustees appointed included Henry Ireton, then "President of the Province of Munster," Colonel Henry Cromwell, Doctor Henry Jones, and John Owen, "Clerk." It was provided that the Act should not take away the right, estate, or interest of any person whatsoever, except the ecclesiastical personages and body specified, those claiming under them by virtue of lease, grant or conveyance made since the 1st October 1641, and those who were in arms against or had assisted, the enemies of the Parliament.

While the Civil Survey sets out the estates and interests of the Archbishop of Dublin, within the county, and similarly of the Dean, Dean and Chapter of St. Patrick's, as at the year 1641, it does not always, at each item, supplement the information furnished by a reference to the new proprietorship of Trinity College. This will be observed particularly in regard to the estates of the Archbishop, distinguished as a rule, under the heading of Church Lands. The Instructions for the taking of the Civil Survey directed no more than a return of ownership as it existed in 1641. Knowledge of these facts and of the terms of the Act of 8 March 1649/50 will it is hoped remove any ambiguity the text may thus present.

The circumstances leading to the sequestration of the ecclesiastical properties concerned, for the re-endowment of Trinity College, will be found narrated in Monck Mason's *History of St. Patrick's Cathedral* (pp. 188-190) and in Mant's *History of the Church of Ireland* (Vol. I, pp. 585-601). D'Alton's summary in his *History of the Archbishops of Dublin* (pp. 273-4) may here be given: "In 1647, on the surrender of Dublin to the commissioners of the parliament, one of their first acts was to prohibit the use of the Book of Common Prayer, and require the directory for worship to be adopted in all the churches of the city. The clergy of the Established Church, who had gathered into Dublin while it was occupied by Ormonde, protested against this order and presented a remonstrance to the Commissioners but without success. . . . In two years afterwards, however, when Archbishop Bulkeley preached his farewell sermon to his clergy in St. Patrick's Cathedral . . . the Common Prayer was read by William Pilsworth, minister; but for doing so, the usurping powers visited them with severe punishment, not only committing the archbishop but all who were present to prison. Nor did the hostility of the usurping powers to this prelate cease even there." D'Alton then refers to the passing "immediately afterwards" of the Act of 8 March 1649/50. "On the day," he adds "in which this act was passed, the same parliament entered into resolutions for the abolition of the hierarchy in Ireland, and the discontinuance of the Book of Common Prayer."

It may further be added that the Act of 8 March 1649/50 is said to have been "occasioned" by the Sermon on the spiritual state of Ireland, preached before Parliament, by Dr. John Owen, Cromwell's chaplain in Ireland. Owen was one of the Trustees under the Act and a communication to him on the future government of the College, is printed, with a biographical note by Dunlop, in *Ireland under the Commonwealth* (Vol. I, p. 10). The Order of 24th June 1647 prohibiting the Book of Common Prayer will be found with other relevant documents in the recently published volume of the *Tanner Letters* edited by Mr. Charles McNeill (p. 245); see, also, the *Final Report on the Carte Papers* in the 32nd Rep. Dep. K. Pub. Rec. (England); the remonstrance, dated 9 July 1647, sent in reply to the order is printed, in full, in the *History of St. Patrick's*.

At the Restoration of Charles II., particular provision was made in the Act of Settlement in regard to the possessions of which ecclesiastical persons had been deprived by "the fury and violence of the late times." To the lands "of which they were actually seized, or by themselves or their tenants possessed, in the year 1641," such ecclesiastical

persons were forthwith to be restored.²⁶ Abstracts of the grants subsequently made to the Archbishop of Dublin under the Acts of Settlement and Explanation,²⁷ are printed in the 15th *Annual Report of the Irish Record Commission*. In the *History of St. Patrick's*, at the year 1671, Monck Mason states "There is in the rolls office a letter from King Charles II to John, Lord Berkeley, Lord Lieutenant of Ireland dated 2 July ordering at the suit of the Dean and Chapter of St. Patrick's that letters patent should pass the great seal granting to them a confirmation of all their lands, advowsons, tithes or other property and also all their privileges liberties and jurisdictions expressed or mentioned to have been granted in an ancient book or statute called '*Dignitas Decani*' . . . This letter commands further that an act of parliament confirming these liberties should be prepared to pass at the next Session and that commissioners should be appointed to investigate by inquisition what possessions did properly belong to the Dean and Chapter." That this was not carried into effect was due to the fact, it is suggested by the author, that no meeting of parliament in Ireland took place, after the date of the letter, during the remainder of the reign of Charles II.

A Calendar of Leases and Deeds of St. Patrick's Cathedral, 1660-1689, prepared from a Book among the Muniments of the Chapter, has been made available to students by Canon Leslie in the *Jn. R. S. A.* vol. lxiv (1934) and vol. lxv (1935).

Some other instances, specified by the Civil Survey, of changes in proprietorship, during Commonwealth times, may here be mentioned.

At the beginning of the Survey for the baronies of Nethercross, Coolock and Castleknock, a statement occupying a page to itself, announces that lands in these baronies, formerly belonging to Philip Hore of Kilsoghan [Kilsallaghan] were then possessed by Alderman Thomas Hooke of Dublin, and that by direction of the Lord Deputy and Council they were not to be disposed of until further order. The Alderman's name is given as Cook, in this statement, at Castleknock barony (p. 86), but there can be little doubt that the person referred to throughout was Thomas Hook, Mayor of Dublin in 1654. A Thomas Hook, probably the same person, was one of the Dublin Civil Survey Commissioners according to Hardinge's list, already quoted. At the Restoration, it may be added, Philip Hore recovered his estate,²⁷ while Thomas Hook, still described as an Alderman of Dublin, procured a grant of lands in Westmeath and Armagh.²⁸ Again, Lady Culme, "by virtue of a grant from the Parliament of England" possessed Balcarrick formerly the property of Nicholas Hollywood, Irish Papist, of Artaine (p. 49); similarly Lady Waller, late wife of Sir Simon Harcourt, had succeeded to the estate of Luke Netterfield of Corballies (p. 50 and p. 52); Miles Corbet, Lord Chief Baron of the Exchequer, had entered into the possession of the estate of John Talbot of Malahide (p. 195) and Sir Charles Coote had succeeded Lord

Gormanston in the proprietorship of lands within Balscadden parish (p. 73). For the ultimate disposition of all the lands returned by the Civil Survey, the Dublin Book of S. & D. should be consulted.

The manorial jurisdiction of the Archbishop of Dublin, to which, *inter alia*, as already indicated, Trinity College had succeeded, is reported throughout the barony of Nethercross where the obligation of "Suit and Service," at the Manor Court of Swords, is returned in respect of whole parishes or at particular denominations of land. Lands forming the manor of Swords are so denoted within and outside the parish of that name. At Lusk parish (pp. 117-133) the respective premises are described as part of the Lord Archbishop's liberty "doing suit and service at Swords"; likewise, the whole parishes of Portrane [Portraine] and Clanmedan [Clonmethan]; at Finglas parish (pp. 133-47) the obligation is returned in respect of one small denomination (p. 141) rendered presumably at the Archbishop's Court in the manor of that name.

Unhappily, owing to the loss of the Civil Survey, similar particulars are not available for the barony of Uppercross. The details appearing at Appendix B merely indicate the names of Church lands and their owners in that region; such attenuated particulars will, therefore, have to be read, in regard to their juridical significance, in the knowledge of other and earlier documents.

It may be said that manors and parishes are frequently found to bear the same name, though it does not follow that they are equated in content. Names and localities of the manors comprising the temporal possessions of the Archbishop of Dublin, drawn from authoritative sources, may, therefore, in the first instance be furnished by way of guide to the details set out parochially at Appendix B. Some recently published texts illustrating the nature and extent of the jurisdiction will then be instanced.

A detailed return of the manors appertaining to the Archbishopric of Dublin, a century after the Norman Settlement, will be found in the Account of Master Thomas de Chaddesworth who had been appointed by Edward the First, *custos* of the Temporalities on the death in 1271 of Fulk de Sandford Archbishop of Dublin. It was first printed in the *Proceedings of the Royal Irish Academy*,²⁹ with an introduction by Sir William Betham; it again appeared in the 36th *Report of the Deputy Keeper of the Public Records* (p. 36), in the course of the Pipe Roll series edited by Mr. M. J. McEnery. This *Account*, covering a period of seven years—55 Hen. III.—5 Ed. I., provides detailed particulars of the revenues derived from the manors and their members of the archbishopric some of which had appertained to the See of Glendaloch, united to that of Dublin in 1216. The names of the manors, as specified in the Account, printed in the Pipe Roll Series, are—Swedes [Swordes], Ballymor, Clondolcan [Clondalkin], Finglas, Rathcul [Rathcool], Newtown, Taullath [Tallaght], Coloyne [St. Sepulchre's], Senekil [Shankhill], Castlekevyn, Kilmasantan, and Bretach [Brittas].

Names of some members of these manors are also furnished such as Lusk—at Swords, Dalkey—at Shankhill, Glynseyl³⁰—at Castlekevin; likewise names of lands are returned from which rents were received.

These manors were known as the *Crocea* or Crosslands and in process of time,

with the exception of Castlekevin and its members, were denominated the baronies of Uppercross and Nethercross. "Some few centuries after the establishment of Christianity in Ireland in the fifth century," writes D'Alton³¹ "those districts of the country known by the name of Croceæ or Crosslands were dedicated to the church and most extensive jurisdiction was given to the abbots and bishops. Such were the Croceæ of Ulster . . . Meath . . . Kildare and such were the Croceæ or liberties of the cross of the Archbishop of Dublin. The cross lands of Dublin appear to have been partly in the northern and partly in the southern sections of the county and the names of two of its baronies . . . Nether-Cross and Upper-Cross, although not precisely commensurate with the ancient croceæ do still designate large portions of their superficies."

It is true that these areas were substantially coterminous in 1838, the date of publication of D'Alton's *History of Dublin*; some five or six years later, however, these baronies were re-constituted as a result of which their identity with the ancient crosses may be said to have, in a great measure, disappeared.³²

The Civil Survey indicates the manors or *Croceæ* originally forming the northern barony of Nethercross—Swords and Lusk with their members Clonmethan and Portraine together with the manor of Finglas; some of those to be ascribed to the Barony of Uppercross are indicated in a paper entitled "The Norman Settlement in Leinster—the Cantreds near Dublin" by Mr. James Mills.³³ Accompanying Mr. Mills' contribution is a map showing the district reserved in the grant of Leinster by Henry II., to Strongbow. In this map Church lands not affected by the Norman Settlement are specially noted. Within this district the archbishop's possessions, which Mills states "exceeded those of the native chief Mac Gillamocholmog," centred round three leading manors "Tallaght, Clondalkin and Rathcoole, with Brittas dependent and a minor detached group about Kilsantan in the upper Dodder valley. All that did not belong to the archbishop it was endeavoured to preserve directly in the hands of the Crown."

The baronial and county locations of the manor of Castlekevin and its members, prior to the year 1606, when the county of Wicklow was formed, are not so easy of determination; this may be seen from a note given at a later stage with reference to the original extent of the county of Dublin.

The archiepiscopal manors, representing detached areas, at considerable distances from each other, formed a unit of distinct secular jurisdiction exercised over a long period of time as the circumstances of war and peace permitted. The privileges and powers which had been conferred by royal charters,³⁴ granted to archbishops of Dublin, were interpreted by Betham in his introduction to Chaddesworth's Account thus:

"These extensive liberties and free customs were equal to those of a palatine county or honour and constituted the Archbishop's lordships, manors and crosses into a feudal dignity or principality, similar to a county palatine. They are indeed nearly identical to those granted to the Earl of Ulster. The only grant of more extensive liberties was made to Hugh de Lacy of the lordship of Meath in which the King reserved

only homage and fealty. The Archbishop's seneschal was made the supreme judge within his lordship's manors and crosses in all cases, as well criminal as civil."

The wide extent of the jurisdiction is established in a series of inquisitions taken over the years 1257-1263. "The subject dealt with," states Mr. Charles McNeill, "is the temporal jurisdiction exercised in the manorial courts of the archbishopric of Dublin under the first three prelates promoted to the See by the influence of the Kings of England." This quotation is from Mr. McNeill's paper "The Secular Jurisdiction of the early Archbishops of Dublin" with which is printed in the *Journal of the R.S.A.*, the inquisitions indicated.³⁵ The occasion of the inquisitions, Mr. McNeill explains, was the conflict, from the outset, on the subject of jurisdiction between the Irish government and the Church. Matters and causes brought before the Archbishop's court in some seven manors,³⁶ are recalled and attested, by jurors "sworn to tell the truth concerning the customs and liberties used in the time of the predecessors of the Lord Fulk now Archbishop of Dublin." A distinct inquisition made in parliament, at Castledermot, 18 June, 1264, finds, *inter alia*, that all the pleas of the Crown "as of death, murder. . ." etc., with four exceptions specified,³⁷ were taken in the Court of Luke, Archbishop of Dublin, and of his successor, Archbishop Fulk, "to the loss and prejudice of the Lord Edward and his liberties. . . ."

Mr. McNeill discusses the question as to whether the jurisdiction exercised after the English occupation was by virtue of a royal grant or a right of the Irish church enjoyed previously; he then proceeds to the consideration of the jurisdiction conferred in ancient Irish law. Concluding this valuable paper Mr. McNeill summarises the contents, and indicates the knowledge to be gained by the examination, of the important inquisitions he had thus made available to students: "Officials and their functions, the affairs of private individuals, some stirring incidents in their lives, and occurrences of which localities well known to ourselves were the scenes, are brought into view with distinctness, variety and detail through a period of eighty years in the early days of the English settlement."

It may here be interjected that, in the succeeding century, the existing position of the rural population on the archiepiscopal manors, the system of agriculture followed, the tenures and areas of land, were the subjects of Extents or inquisitions made in the year 1326. That for the manor of St. Sepulchre was published in full by Mr. James Mills,³⁸ the series as a whole providing him with material for his paper "Tenants and Agriculture near Dublin in the 14th century."³⁹ These documents were again drawn upon by the Very Revd. Dr. Myles Ronan for his chapter on the "Archiepiscopal Manors" in a series of papers entitled "*Anglo-Norman Dublin and Diocese*" published in *The Irish Ecclesiastical Record* (1935-6).

Coming closer to the period of the Civil Survey is the "Court Book of the Liberty

of Saint Sepulchre within the Jurisdiction of the Archbishop of Dublin 1586-1590⁴⁰; this has been edited by Mr. Herbert Wood, formerly Deputy Keeper of the Public Record Office, and published as the extra volume of the *R. S. A.* for the year 1930. The matters here recorded illustrate the kind of jurisdiction exercised within approximately half a century of the date for which the Civil Survey testifies. Names of free tenants, litigants, jurors and officials come into view in respect of proceedings heard in the manor courts of St. Sepulchre, Finglas, Tallaght, Dalkey, Ballymore, Swords and Lusk. Names similar to those of free tenants, will be found again, in the present volume, within the barony of Nethercross; in the absence of the Civil Survey for Uppercross barony, Mr. Wood's text is, therefore, of particular value.

To the respective matters coming within the cognizance of the Court Leet, Court Baron, Court of Record and Court of Piepowder, Mr. Wood affords lucid guidance. The archbishop's jurisdiction, however, he points out, was gradually narrowing: "The last exercise of the criminal jurisdiction, a conviction for forgery took place in 1803, and the civil bill jurisdiction was taken away by 7 George IV, c. 41, . . . The little legal authority remaining disappeared in 1856 when, by the Act of 19 and 20 Victoria, c. 57, the legal jurisdiction of the Court of the Liberty and Manor of St. Sepulchre was abolished, and the legal business handed over to such courts of law as would have enjoyed such authority if the Liberty had not existed . . ."

It is a happy circumstance in regard to the other barony for which the Civil Survey is wanting, Newcastle, that there also exists a record of the manorial jurisdiction exercised within that region during the last ten years of the 16th century. To the late Professor Edmund Curtis students are indebted for "The Court Book of Esker and Crumlin 1592-1600" printed in the *Journal of the R. S. A.* during the years 1929 and 1930. A valuable analysis and discussion of the many matters of interest revealed by the text particularly in regard to the kinds of tenures that obtained on an Anglo-Irish feudal manor is provided by Professor Curtis whose exposition is introduced by an historical note: The parishes of Esker and Crumlin originally formed part of the demesne in the Vale of Dublin "which Henry II annexed to the Crown and which was under John organised as the four royal manors of Newcastle Lyons, Tassagard or Saggard, Esker and Crumlin and these were ruled for the Crown by Seneschals whose office continued into the nineteenth century. . . . At first they were farmed by the Sheriff and governed by a royal bailiff. Then as the King who was lord of these Manors, was never present, the Government, to make what profit it could out of them, leased them to middlemen, or let them to farm or allowed the tenants easy terms. . ."

Particulars of an Extent of the Manor of Esker, "dating from Henry VIII's or Edward VI's time," contained in the Court Book, are given by Professor Curtis with a list of the chief names among the tenants. From the Court Book proceedings he also instances many names of suitors who were freeholders and of tenants who acted as

jurors. The value of these particulars, in the absence of the Newcastle Civil Survey, are enhanced by another consideration pointed out by Curtis: "Manorial records so abundant in England, are so rare in Ireland, that this Court book must be regarded as one of the few sources we have for the workings of a lord's court, a court which we must remember had hundreds of others like it working in Ireland at the time. . ."

In this last connection, the present volume indicates at least a score of manorial courts operating within the county. Courts Leet and Courts Baron were held at Merrion, Booterstown, Dundrum, Monkstown and Carrickmines, all within the Half Barony of Rathdown. In the northern baronies, Balrothery notably—Nethercross has already been noticed, manorial jurisdiction is frequently recorded. At Jordanstown in Lusk parish, the Lord of Howth "kept Court Leet and Court Baron in this and the other towns belonging to him in the parish"; the Dean of Christ Church held Court Leet twice in the year "in the Church of Balcadden"; the Lord of Ormond held both Courts Leet and Baron in the same place. At Howth, in Coolock barony, where the owner derived "under letters patent granted to his ancestors by Henry II" the extent of the jurisdiction is briefly noted: "waifs and strays and felons goods belonged to the proprietor, the Lord Baron of Howth."

The returns as to Tithes, appearing throughout the text, either in the course of parish boundary descriptions, or at specific lands, call for some observations. While the owners both ecclesiastical and lay are specified, and frequently lessees, the value of the tithes, in any instance, is not given, though a requisite of the Civil Survey Instructions. It is not easy to explain this omission, but having regard to the disagreement which existed between the Commissioners and the Jurors, on the value of land, a similar difference may have arisen as to that of tithes. The absence of this feature is to be regretted since it would have provided a guide to the state of agriculture and have afforded a measure of comparison for earlier periods in respect of which, to some extent, this particular information is available; see the Royal Visitation of Dublin, 1615, and Archbishop Bulkeley's Visitation of 1630, edited by Very Revd. Dr. Myles V. Ronan in *Archivium Hibernicum*, vol. VIII, n.s. 1941.

In other respects also, these returns are silent, namely as to the title under which lay persons had become possessed of tithes—that is to say whether by Letters Patent from the Crown, by inheritance, or by purchase. It may be recalled that the lay proprietorship of tithes, extensively recorded by the Civil Survey, was a consequence of the suppression of Religious Houses: "At the period of the Reformation one-half of the entire tithes of Ireland had passed into the hands of monasteries of which no fewer than 382 were suppressed throughout Ireland by King Henry VIII subsequent to the year 1537."⁴¹ The Acts directing the dissolution⁴² vested the Tithes and other possessions of Religious Houses in the Crown in as ample a manner as they were held

by such Religious Houses. By the same Acts the Crown was enabled to dispose of these acquired possessions by Letters Patent. As a result "laymen though incapable of performing ecclesiastical duties . . . were suddenly put in possession of ecclesiastical estates and invested with titles to tithes."⁴³ The lay proprietorship returned by the text may be said, therefore, to have originally been derived by virtue of grants from the Crown.

These grants very frequently reserved rents payable to the Crown, called Crown rents, which formed part of the hereditary revenues of the Sovereign; less frequently, such grants, also reserved rents called "Post-Corn" rents which were payable to high officers of State during their term of Office. In the present text no reference is made to either of these classes of rents. The officials indicated also received, as part of their emoluments, the tithes of rectories and lands, a fact evidenced by the Civil Survey. It is with the Port-corn rents and tithes thus payable that a note of explanation is here called for by way of guidance.

While the Civil Survey specifies within the parishes of Ballyboghil [Baille na bAcaille] (p. 48) and Santry (198-9), tithes payable to the "Castle of Dublin" and "to the Sword" it would appear that tithes of other places within the county of Dublin were also so payable; these will presently be indicated, as also the tithes of those parishes subject to Port-corn rents. These facts largely emerge, it may be said, as a result of the close investigation made over a century and a half ago by G. E. Howard, at one time "Attorney to the King's rents in the Exchequer." The results of his wide research are available in his "*Treatise of the Exchequer and Revenue of Ireland*," published in 1776. In a prefatory note Howard states that for the purpose of his work he had examined "the books and records in the several public offices of the Kingdom." His definition of the Port-corn rent may first be given:

"The Port-corn rent was a kind of rent formerly paid by many tenants to the monasteries and abbeys before their dissolution . . . by service, or in kind, by port-corn, or marts, or by rendering of corn, and other produce of the lands. And it is called port from *porto* to carry, or, *quia ad portam monasterii jacebatur*. And the specie of corn so reserved, are wheat, bere, malt and oatmeal; but in one grant beeves are reserved. And in several of the grants so made by the Crown, after the dissolution of the said religious houses, and especially of rectories and tithes, and other the spiritual possessions thereof, this port-corn rent has been reserved, as well as the Crown rent or rent in money."⁴⁴

Howard then proceeds to the subsequent history of this source of revenue:

"All these Port-corn rents were shortly after the dissolution of the abbeys given by the Crown to the Lord Lieutenant, the Master of the Rolls, the Lord Chief Justice, the Lord Chief Baron and the Presidents of Munster and Connaught; and they were accordingly put upon the establishment for the same in the 42nd year of the reign of Queen Elizabeth as appears by the rolls in the Office of his Majesty's Auditor-General

where those allotted to the Lord Lieutenant are under the title, Sword, and are saved and confirmed to them by the Act of Settlement."

Howard supplemented this account by a valuable list of the rectories and tithes in numerous counties charged with Port-corn.⁴⁵ In this list are distinguished the rectories and tithes of which he had found Crown grants reserving Port-corn and those where no evidence of a grant existed save the particulars entered in the Crown Rent rolls. Grants which had thus been examined contained a provision that the Port-corn was to be rendered at the principal town of the county named in the patent to the person appointed by the Lord Lieutenant and in respect of which an allowance was subsequently to be made out of the rent payable to the Crown. "And by constats from the rent rolls of Queen Elizabeth the number of pecks charged on each denomination are mentioned; and they are valued at a certain sum for each peck, as if such sum was to be received in lieu of the port-corn; and the sum at which the pecks were valued is the same sum "which was allowed to be deducted from the Crown rent."

In the category of grants examined appears, under Dublin, the "denomination" or rectory of "Balmadown," (Ballymadun, Balrothery barony). This was charged with 20 pecks at 1/4 per peck, the amount of the rate, and allowance in the Crown rent being the same, viz. £1 : 6 : 8.

The *Fiant*s, Elizabeth, contain particulars of a grant of this rectory, specifying the Crown and Port-corn rents, which may be quoted by way of clarification and illustration:

Fiant 5114—"Grant (under Queen's letter 22 March xxix) to Sir Henry Harrington of the rectory [tithes] of Balmadown, co. Dublin—"To hold for ever in common soccage. Rent £15 : 6 : 8 and rendering yearly 20 pecks of corn, half wheat and bere malt and half oat meal for which 26s/8d will be deducted from the rent. 20 Decr. xxx."

This rectory formed part of the possessions of the Nuns of Grace Dieu O.S.A., as appears by the Extent of 25 October 1540, printed in *Irish Monastic Possessions* 1540-41, ed. by N. B. White M.A. (p. 76). It is there described thus:

"Rectory of Balmedon. Tithes 23 copp. ('couples' of grain)" each 13s. 4d. Held from the late prioress per ind. p. t. a. (for a term of years) by Thomas Fitzsymonds for £15 : 3 : 4. The remaining tithes and the altarages are received by the vicar. Advowson, the King's."

At p. 29 of the present volume the owner of the tithes in 1641 will be found specified.

In the second category of Howard's list, indicating the items in respect of which no grant from the Crown could be found, numerous instances are given under Dublin. These are distinguished by distinct explanations. The first relates to "Cromlin" with which is bracketed the Meath denominations of "Grange and Grange trevett," and

of which, it is stated, that they had been in lease in Elizabeth's reign, with the rectory of Confey in the county of Kildare, at 40 pecks, "which is the charge on the said rectory."

The remaining items "were circumstanced in a different manner" which Howard thus explains:

"It does not appear from the rent rolls that any grants have been made of the following denominations wherein port corn is reserved; they appear from the Auditor General's constats to have been put in charge in the King's rent rolls, at certain yearly rents to be paid by the Chief governor, who might set the tithes for what he could."

"This was afterwards part of the Phoenix Park,⁵⁰ and excluded for building the hospital for antient and maimed officers and soldiers of the army of Ireland."

The first five items in the foregoing list represent former possessions of the Cistercian Abbey of St. Mary, Dublin. They are set out in the Extent of the Abbey made on the 23 October 1540, printed in *Irish Monastic Possessions*, already cited, and likewise in the Appendix to Very Revd. Dr. Myles Ronan's book "*The Reformation in Dublin, 1536-1538*." The same sources also provide particulars of the possessions of the Hospital of St. John of Jerusalem, Kilmainham.

One corresponding item may be quoted here from the Extent published in *Irish Monastic Possessions*.⁵¹ Under "Tithes garbarum (of Sheaves) of divers villas" appears at p. 12, the following entry in reference to Ballyboghil:

"Ballybaghill, with the grange of Drousshoke, Balyngeston, Wolston, Rascall, Maynyscort, Ellyston, and Gerardiston in the par. of Ballybaghill 23 copp. (couples); Lord Leonard Gray; £17."

While it is indicated elsewhere in the Extent that Lord Leonard Gray, late King's deputy, held the "Abbots Lodginge" under lease, the title under which he derived these tithes is not specified. The Abbey of St. Mary was dissolved by the surrender

of William Laundie, the last Abbot on the 28 October 1539.⁵² Gilbert in his introduction to the *Chartularies of the Abbey*⁵³ states that Laundie, as abbot, had "executed leases of several of its [the Abbey's] lands, tithes and possessions to various persons for terms extending from seven to ninety years"; these included the Chief Justice of the King's Bench, the Chief Justice of the Common Pleas and Lord Leonard Gray. Indicating that Suppression was anticipated by the heads of Religious Houses, Thomas Finglas, in a letter written in 1538 to Thomas Cromwell, Lord Privy Seal, printed by Gilbert,⁵⁴ pointed out that Lord Gray had already received a lease from the Abbot of St. Mary's of the "farm of Ballybaghill and Portmernoke."

It may well have been, indeed, that the origin of the Chief Governors emoluments, in these connections, was not unconnected with the desire to secure postponement of suppression, or favourable consideration in other respects, through the influence of important personages of state.

The Crown rent, shown by Howard to have been reserved in respect of the tithes of Ballyboghill, is the same sum, it will be noted, as that shown in the Extent, quoted above, as payable by Lord Leonard Gray to the Abbey, viz. £17.

To what extent these and the other tithes mentioned were collected or leased by successive Chief Governors is another question. In 1763 when this mode of providing for their salaries was altered, it was directed that the tithes and Port-corn rents should henceforth be paid to the Commissioners of Revenue for the use of the Sovereign.⁵⁵ It may be added that until quite recent times the tithes of Ballyboghill and Santry, converted in due course into Tithe Rent Charges, were collected on behalf of the Crown by the Commissioners of Woods, Forests and Land Revenues.

Particulars of the endowments of Religious Houses in respect of lands and tithes are available in various printed sources some of which may here be indicated. In the *Account Roll of the Priory of the Holy Trinity, Dublin, 1337-1346*, edited by James Mills, will be found a rental of the lands of the Priory, circa 1326. Rentals of later dates appear in the Calendar to Christ Church Deeds, the first section of which is printed as Appendix VII to the 20th Rep. of the Dep. of P. R. O. I. For the endowments of Diarmid MacMurrough, King of Leinster, reference will be made to *The Registry of the Priory of All Saints*, edited by Revd. Richard Butler. The *Chartularies of St. Mary's Abbey, Dublin*, edited by J. T. Gilbert have already been indicated. A recent publication by the Irish Manuscripts Commission, edited by Dr. Eric St. John Brooks—the *Register of the Hospital of St. John the Baptist without the New Gate* provides documents for the possessions of the house in several parishes of the city, for the district of Fingal, and throughout the provinces. The Extents, printed by Monck Mason in his *History of St. Patrick's*, of the possessions of the various dignitaries of the Cathedral, particularly in regard to tithes, will be found useful in the determination of lands comprising pre-Reformation parishes. Civil Survey parishes, in the instances collated, showed substantial agreement.

For the fate of the endowments, the *Fiants Henry VIII—Elizabeth*, printed as

Appendices to the *Reports of the Dep. Keeper of the P. R. O. I.*, should be consulted. From these, aided by the Civil Survey returns as to tithes, the areas within the spiritual administration of different Religious Orders prior to the Religious Revolution, may be perceived.

Finally, particular attention may be directed to the *Calendar of the Liber Niger Alani* or Register of Archbishop Alan, edited by the Revd. G. J. Stokes, D.D., and published in the *Journal of the R. S. A.* during the years 1893 and 1897; this directs attention to a wide range of documents of apparently the greatest importance for ecclesiastical, social, and topographical studies within the diocese of Dublin.

Some further observations are called for in regard to the areas forming the baronies of Uppercross and Newcastle, the subject of Appendices A and B. It has already been suggested that the difficulty of mapping satisfactorily the detached and scattered areas of the barony of Uppercross was overcome, at the time of the Down Survey, by amalgamating certain of its areas with the barony of Newcastle; hence the barony of "Newcastle and Uppercross." The detached portion, called the "barony of Uppercross" represents three parishes—Ballymore, Tipperkevin and Ballybought, lying to the west across the mountains, and bounded by the baronies of Naas in Kildare and Talbotstown in Wicklow.

Documents, however, closely contemporaneous with the Down Survey and the Book of Survey and Distribution, did not follow the baronial arrangement which these latter provided. In the Dublin Hearth Money Rolls of the year 1664 (printed in the *Journal of the Kildare Archaeological Society*, vols. X and XI, 1927 and 1930—kindly furnished to me by Very Revd. Canon McGuirk, P.P., Rathfarnham,) the "barony of Newcastle," without any territorial suffix, is specified; similarly comes into view the "barony of Uppercross." At places, parochially located in each barony appear the returns of hearths, owners or occupiers of houses and relative taxation.

There is thus available a source of guidance, in date some nine years subsequent to the Civil Survey, for the determination of the distinctive areas comprising these baronies.

One other source, however, should be mentioned. It is an Act of the Irish Parliament defining the places rated "from time immemorial" in each Dublin barony; this it is desirable to quote in the light of the subsequent extensive revisions of barony boundaries effected in the early years of the Ordnance Survey.

First, it may be recalled that until the enactment of legislation in the 19th century providing for a uniform Valuation and Survey of Ireland, the apportionment of local taxation in respect of Grand Jury assessments was based, it would appear, on "ancient" surveys or applotments. These constituted the "Table" or "Key" of the county on which the treasurer grounded his warrants. The want of uniformity and inequality characterising the system—denominations varying in size, and value were rated at an equal sum, had been recognised for a considerable period of time, but reform was long delayed. To correct an injustice arising from the method of assessment in certain Dublin areas, the Act 13 and 14 Geo. III, cap. XXXIV, (A.D. 1773-4) was passed. It is entitled "An Act for making and amending Publick Roads in the county of Dublin

and for regulating the assessing, applotting and levying of Money in the county of the City of Dublin." The Act created two new Dublin baronies, and changed the title of an existing barony, the "Half barony of Rathdown" becoming the barony of Rathdown." With regard to the new baronies the Act declared that it was expedient "to separate from the barony of Uppercross the liberty of St. Sepulchre's and the liberty of Donore" and to constitute these liberties distinct baronies under such names. As to the remaining part of the barony of Uppercross it was to be "a distinct and separate barony called and known by the name of Uppercross" and to be rated as containing 19,042 acres.

The Act then proceeds to deal with the county as a whole specifying the constituent rating areas of each barony. These details are introduced by the recital: "And whereas the following has been for time immemorial considered as the table or proportionate rate of assessment of said county (except those parts relating to part of the liberty of St. Sepulchre and the liberty of Donore... which last mentioned are deemed to have been overrated by the antient county book or table, be it enacted... that in order to prevent any further dispute the following at all times be considered... the real and authentic rule by which said county is to be assessed."

The table for Uppercross barony is the first to be given and it may be reproduced here, as printed in the Act, in conjunction with that for Newcastle.

The place-names given correspond with those of parishes; the archiepiscopal manors of the See of Dublin, already specified, and Church lands, will be recognised in the Table for the barony of Uppercross.

In a subsequent Act, 26 Geo. III, c.14 (1786) regulating matters relative to Grand Jury presentments, the Tables given above were confirmed as likewise those for the

remainder of the county. From these Acts, and the other sources indicated, the rural and urban units comprising the barony of Uppercross and that of Newcastle, as at the date of the Civil Survey, may with reasonable certainty be established. For the ready convenience of the investigator, notes are again given at Appendix B distinguishing the relative parishes of the amalgamated barony of "Newcastle and Uppercross."

Finally, for the county as a whole, and for the baronies as specified in the foregoing Acts of 1773 and 1786, the student has available William Duncan's map (scale $2\frac{1}{2}$ inches to a mile) made in 1821. While barony boundaries and townland names are shown, those of parishes are not indicated. To this map Major Nolan of the Ordnance Survey directed particular attention in a lecture delivered at the Scientific meeting of the Royal Dublin Society held on the 23rd March, 1943. An error in the detached portion of the barony of Uppercross, shown by Inset, at the point where the three counties of Dublin, Kildare and Wicklow meet, was then pointed out with other interesting features of the map, copies of which can be seen at the National Library and the R.D.S.

In the nineteenth century, subsequent to the date of Duncan's map, profound changes were affected in the boundaries of the Dublin baronies. The legislation⁸⁷ providing for the Valuation and Survey of the country directed that "detached or isolated parcels of land" then belonging to, or forming part of certain baronies, but locally situated within, or surrounded by other baronies were to be comprised and included in the baronies in which they were so locally situated or whereto they adjoined.⁸⁸ Under the Act 6 & 7 Wm. IV., c. 84, for example, the three parishes of Uppercross barony—Ballymore, Tipperkevin, and Ballybought, were severed from the county of Dublin and transferred to the barony of Naas, co. Kildare; but, perhaps, the most widespread changes were effected in pursuance of the Act of 5 & 6 Vic. Cap. 96 entitled "An Act to alter the number and define the boundaries of the several baronies of the County of Dublin." Under this Act the barony of Dublin was erected and the ancient Balrothery divided into the baronies of Balrothery East and West; the baronies of Donore and St. Sepulchre then seem to disappear after an existence of some seventy years. In due course the revisions directed found expression on the *Ordnance Survey maps* and in the *Census of Townlands* publication. Without some knowledge or warning, workers on the Civil Survey would find many difficulties in reconciling the parochial locations given by that text with those of the modern arrangement. An effort has, therefore, been made at each opening baronial page to indicate the changes effected by the legislation mentioned.

The County of Dublin as it is known to-day, and whose territorial units were the subject of so much revision, may be said to date from 1606 when, in the formation of Wicklow county definition was given to its boundaries. Prior to that year its extent was certainly greater than the present area of the county indicates, but the exact districts comprising it are not easy of demonstration.⁸⁹

In the year 1374 a writ was issued directing enquiry as to the county in which the "church of Glendalough" was located. Erck,⁹⁰ who mentions this writ, does not

provide the return which he states was dated the 3rd July, 47th and 48th years of Edward III. Possessions, however, of *All Hallowes* at Glendaloch and Rathdrum are returned as within the county of Dublin by an inquisition taken at Swords on November 30, 1538.⁶¹ More than two centuries prior to this an Ordinance of the year 1297⁶² had described the county of Dublin "as too much scattered" its "parts too far removed from each other and dispersed," to wit, "into Ulster and Meath, and then Leinster with the Vale of Dublin." In 1453-4 it was directed that a Commission be issued out of the Chancery for the extending and assessing of all the lands in the county of Dublin, saving the Cross, all previous extents being cancelled.⁶³ In closely succeeding years—1455 and 1460, Ordinances passed in relation to many matters, particularly that of the protection of the marches, refer to, as then existing, the baronies of Castleknock, Coolock, Balrothery, Newcastle of Lyons, and Rathdown.⁶⁴ "From ancient times" recites a Statute of 1460 "the Archbishops of Dublin . . . have great property upon the borders of the marches in the county of Dublin that is to say from Dalkey to Ballymore"⁶⁵; this suggests a southern boundary. But the circumstances related in this document can scarcely be said to be conducive to settled or well-defined boundaries. The property referred to, it appears, was "now greatly wasted not only by Irish enemies and English rebels . . . but much by outrageous and immeasurable alienation. . . . So that the Archbishop that now is cannot be resident there to defend the said property, unless there be a reformation." At a much later date the marches are more definitely particularized and the southern extent of the barony of Rathdown indicated. In 1566 Thomas Fitzwilliam of Merrion was appointed Seneschal⁶⁶ and given "chief rule of the whole marches of Dublin; that is to say the barony of Rathdown the nations of the Walshes, Aspolls, and Harrolds and all other inhabitants of this barony, Fercullen and Glancapp only excepted." The Order in Council of January, 1606, for erecting the county of Wicklow,⁶⁷ directs that "a part of the barony of Rathdown containing the countries of Fercullen, Glancapp and the Archbooles country, lying beyond the river of Bray etc., now bearing with the county of Dublin *and accounted parte thereof*, should be added to the Irish countries as a parcell of the county of Wicklow." Of the other territories that were to form the new county "some of them have been held and taken to be of no county or shire, and the residue of them doubtful and of what countie they be." Yet this Order in council declares that "the countie of Dublin as it now standeth is of too large extent," and that accordingly, it was to be reduced by the subtraction of the territory indicated and henceforth to be called the Half Barony of Rathdown; in statute measure this represented thirty-four thousand acres, too small an area to justify the language of the Order as to the excessive size of the county. Clearly other areas, apparently incapable of localisation or definition by the Inquisition⁶⁸ on which this Order was founded, were within the County of Dublin "as it then stood." To such areas, it may be suggested, the *Patent Rolls* of James I.

provide a guide. Lands the subject of grants by the Crown are there localised in this form "Dublin now Wicklow" or "Wicklow late Carlow." Under the former designation, lands granted to Sir Henry Broncar, President of Munster, include those of Castlemacadam situate in the barony of Arklow.* Haliday in his *History of the Scandinavian Kingdom of Dublin*⁷⁰ points out, that the boundaries of the united diocese of Dublin and Glendaloch were coterminous with the Scandinavian Kingdom of Dublin extending from Arklow to the river Delvin north of Skerries; originally, he adds, ecclesiastical jurisdiction was concurrent with that of the civil ruler. By way of further suggestion that the original county of Dublin was to be equated with the Scandinavian Kingdom, he instances the admiralty jurisdiction of the mayors of Dublin which extended between the limits above stated.

Expression may again be given to the hope that the publication of these volumes will evoke enquiry as to the missing set of Civil Survey barony books. The text of one of the baronies in the present volume, it will be observed (Castleknock, p. 221) bears on the opening page the inscription "Duplicate." This indicates that the collection of Thomas Taylor, a sub-Commissioner of the Court of Claims, and ancestor of Lord Headfort, included representative sections of both sets of the Civil Survey. Sections may also have passed or been loaned to other commissioners or sub-commissioners who omitted to return them to their proper habitat. Attention may also be drawn to the printing of the Civil Survey of the Half-Barony of Rathdown in "*Desiderata Curiosa Hibernica*," attributed to Lodge, published in 1772 (Vol. II). This "Select Collection of State Papers" is stated to have been "Faithfully transcribed from original or authentic copies," but the source of the Civil Survey text is not given. Though not described as the Civil Survey, external, and internal evidence, establishes it as such. On the title-page the correct date of the Commission under which it was made is given: "By order of Charles Fleetwood, Lord Deputy, October 4th, 1654"; likewise the date of the Commissioners' Certificate, 3 November 1655, agrees with that given in the present text. While the indexes of lands and proprietors are omitted, and allowing for the printing of "the" instead of "ye" and the expansion of certain contractions, the text substantially agrees with that now published. A slight variation however, in the rendering of place-names—Donnebrook, for Donabrooke in the present volume, Rathmichael for Rath Michell, induces the view, unless such renderings are to be regarded as a modernized representation, that the Civil Survey in *Desiderata Curiosa Hibernica* was derived from the duplicate set.

Certified copies, too, would be most valuable. It is believed that reposing amongst legal papers there must be many of these relating to particular baronies, parishes or lands. In previous volumes those brought to light by the late Professor Curtis, and by Professor James Hogan, and subsequently published, have been noticed.

Commission for Surveying of Lands.¹

THE said Commissioners,² by virtue of the authority and trust committed unto them in and by one Act of Parliament,³ entitled, "An Act for the speedy and effectuall Satisfaction of the Adventurers for Lands in Ireland, and of the Arreares due to the Souldiery there, and of other publique Debts," do hereby authorize and appoint Henry Waddington, James Shane, Henry Greenoway, and Sebastian Brigham, Esqrs.,⁴ or any three or more of them, to hold and keep one or more courts of survey, for inquiring and finding out of all and every the honors, baronies, castles, mannors, messuages, lands, tenements, rents, annuities, reversions, remainders, possessions, and other hereditaments whatsoever, which at any time since the twenty-third day of October, in the year 1641, did belong unto any person or persons, whose lands upon the said 23rd day of October were, or at any time since are forfeited to the Commonwealth by vertue of an Act of Parliament, entituled, "An Act for the speedy and effectual Reducing of the Rebels in his Majestie's Kingdome of Ireland to their due Obedience to his Majestie and the Crown of England,"⁵ or by any other Act or Acts of Parliament,⁶ and likewise to inquire of and find out all such honors, baronies, castles, manors, lands, tenements, rents and hereditaments belonging unto the Crown in the year 1630, or at any time since; and also to inquire of and find out all honors, baronies, castles, mannors, lands, tenements, rents, or other hereditaments, lately belonging to any archbishop, bishop, dean, dean and chapter, or other officer, belonging to that hierarchy in Ireland, in the right of his archbishoprick, bishoprick, deanery or office aforesaid, within any of the baronies of Kilkeny, Rathconrath, Demifoore, Moyashell or Moycashell, Moygoish, Corkerry, Delvin, Ffarbill, tertriory of Birrawny, lands of Moydrum, within the county of Westmeath, together with all houses, edifices, timber, woods, mines, and other appurtenances belonging to all and every the premises within the county and places aforesaid; and to survey the same and make returne thereof distinctly by themselves, that is to say, fforfeited lands, with the appurtenances, by themselves; Crown lands, with the appurtenances by themselves; and lands belonging to the said hierarchy, by themselves. In the holding and keeping of which courts of survey, the said Henry Waddington, &c., or any three or more of them, are hereby authorized and required to send for such persons as they shall judge any way able to informe them concerning the premises to come before them, and examine the said persons, upon oath, for the

better discovery of what they know in and about the said premises. And it is further ordered, that in making returns of the said survey the said Henry Waddington, &c., doe observe and put in execution the instructions hereunto annexed ; and that before they doe act anything by vertue of this commission, they doe take the oath ensuing, viz. : " You shall faithfully promise and swear, in the presence of the great and mighty God, that you shall well and truly execute the power and trust to you committed, by vertue of this commission and instructions, according to the best of your skill and knowledge." And the said Henry Waddington and James Shane are to administer the said oath each unto other. And they, or any one or more of them, having so taken the said oath, are hereby authorized to administer the same unto the rest of the persons hereby appointed for the execution of this commission and instructions, as aforesaid.

DATED AT DUBLIN, THE 2ND OF JUNE, 1654.

Instructions to be observed by Henry Wadington, James Shane, Henry Greenoway, and Sebastian Brigham, Esqrs., in the Holding and Keeping of Courts of Survey of the Honors, Baronies, Castles, Lands, Tenements and Hereditaments, in and by the annexed Commission given them in Charge to survey, and in the surveying of the same accordingly.

You are forthwith, upon receipt of your commission, to meet in some convenient place within the said county, to take the oath prescribed in your said commission, for the due execution of the trust thereby committed unto you, and to consider in what barony or place you shall judge it most convenient to appoint the first court of survey to bee kept, in order to the prosecution of your said commission, and accordingly to appoint time and place for that end. And for the more effectual performance of the said service, you are authorized to adjourne from time to time, and from place to place, in such manner as you shall judge to bee most conducive to the speedy and effectuall discharge of the said work. And in the first place you are to survey, according to the tenor of your commission and these instructions, the baronies of Clonlownan, Moycashell, Moygoish, Corkerry, Delvin, Ffarbill, territory of Birawny, and lands of Moydrum adjoining thereunto, being the baronies that are fallen by lot to the souldiery within the said county.

You are with all convenient speed to enter into and upon all and every the honors, baronies, mannors, castles, messuages, and other the lands, tenements, and hereditaments whatsoever mentioned in your commission, lying within the said county of Westmeath. And by your oathes of good and lawfull men, and by all other lawfull wayes and meanes, you are to inquire and find out the premises, and every of them, with their and every of their appurtenances. And you are to view and survey the same, or cause the same to be viewed and surveyed, so as the premises and every of them may (either by your own view, or by the view and testimony of good and lawfull persons, upon oath) bee certainly, distinctly, and entirely known from other lands, by their respective qualities, quantities, or number of acres by estimation (according to one and twenty foot to the perch, and one hundred and sixty perches to the acre), also by their names, scituacion, parish, or place where the same doe lye, with their respective meets and bounds ; the bogs, woods, and barren mountains,

belonging to the respective premises, or any of them, being mentioned, and the quantity thereof estimated and distinguished from the profitable lands in the said survey. And for the better execution of your said commission, you are, as often as you see cause, to summon one or more juries, and to give them in charge to inquire and find out all and every the particulars of these instructions, and to cause such juries, when and as often as you shall judge if necessary, to view and tread the meets and bounds of the premises, and to forme all such other matters and things as are perfectly inquirable in courts of survey, as you shall give the same in charge unto them.

You are, by the like waies and meanes, to inquire of and find out the true yearly value of the premisses, and of every of them, as the same were lett for, or worth to be lett, in the year 1640, or at any time before ; and also what part of the premisses are chargeable with any pious and charitable use or uses ; and also to inquire of and survey, or cause to be surveyed, the buildings, houses, edifices, timber, woods, open quarries, or mines, upon the premises—and to make true and particular returns of the same in your bookes of survey.

You are to call before you all such persons as now are, or formerly have been, stewards, bayliffs, reeves, or collectors of rents, issues, revenues or profits of the premises, or any part thereof ; and likewise all such persons as now are, or formerly have been, tenants of the premises, or any part thereof, and also such other persons as you conceive may best know the premisses, or any of them, or as many of the said persons as you can conveniently summon to appear before you, and to examine them upon oath concerning the meets and bounds of the premisses, and concerning the rents, issues, profits, valuations, royalties, perquisites of courts, tythe, or impropriations, rights, titles, and other emoluments unto the premises, or any of them, belonging or appertaining, or held, or enjoyed with the same, as parte, parcell, or member thereof, or appendant to the same, together with their and every of their particular values, which you are distinctly to returne in your bookes of survey as aforesaid.

You are further strictly to inquire and examine as aforesaid what court-rolls, rentalls, bookes of survey, books of accompts, or what other records, evidences, or writings touching every the premises or any part of them, any of the said persons have come to the knowledge of ; and where and in whose custody the same do remayne ; which said court-rolls, rentalls, bookes of accompt, or other records, evidences, and writings you are to demand and receive into your custody.

In returning your survey of any honors, mannors, lands, tenements, or hereditaments, belonging to the Crown, or to archbishops, bishops, deans, deans and chapters, or other officers belonging to that hierarchy, you are particularly to inquire, by your waies and means aforesaid, what leases are in being of any part of the said last-mentioned premisses, when the same did respectively commence, for what terme granted, to whom the same were so granted, what rents and other duties were reserved thereupon, who are the present tenants of such lands so granted, and in whose right they hold the same, and when and from whom such right is or hath been made over unto them, or unto the persons for or from whom they hold the same respectively.

In case you find variance in the evidence which shall be given, touching the extent or valuation of the premises, or any part of them, or any other particular given in

charge, and if the said variation or difference bee considerable, or if you conceive the evidence to differ from truth to the prejudice of the Commonwealth, or any other person, you are in those cases, as well by your own view as by such other good waies and meanes as you judge fitt, to informe yourselves of the truth in such particulars, and to certify as well the said evidence at large as your own judgment touching those particulars with the reasons inducing you to vary from such evidence.

Where you shall find no possibility, by reason of the wastnes or depopulation of the country, to make so particular a survey as is directed, or to inform yourselves so exactly of the meets, bounds, or other certenties of the premisses, or any of them, as is before required, you are in such cases to use your best wayes and meanes you can for the discovery of all and every the particulars herein given you in charge, and to certify upon all such particulars the manner of your proceedings and the causes why you cannot returne the said survey of them according to the instructions given you.

And because it is required that the quantity or number of acres contained in the premisses, and in every part or parcell of them, should be distinctly and particularly admeasured, you are, therefore, out of the survey taken by you of the premises, and every part of the same, to cause an abstract to bee drawn, containing the names of all and every such parcells of land as shall bee by you surveyed in every respective barony, according to the tenor of your commission, with their respective bounds and meets, and the parishes or places where the same do respectively lie, not mentioning the quantity or value of the same ; and the said abstract so drawn you are to deliver to such persons as shall be authorized and commissioned to admeasure the same. In which abstract you are to distinguish which of the said lands are forfeited lands, and also which lands are Crown lands, and which lands are lands lately belonging to any archbishop, bishop, dean, dean and chapter, or other officers of that hierarchy to the end the same may be distinctly admeasured, and distinct plotts returned of the same.

And for the better assistance of the said persons who shall be appointed to admeasure the premisses, or any part of them, you are hereby authorized and required by warrants under your hand, to appoint (out of the inhabitants of the said county), such and so many fitt persons as shall be judged necessary to attend the said surveyors in admeasuring of the premises, or any parts thereof, for to show and tread out the meets and bounds of any of the said lands respectively ; and also to informe and make known, as often as there shall be occasion, the meets of the several baronies and parishes, and the course that the said meets and bounds doe runne.

And for the more full and better discovery of the interest of the Commonwealth in or out of lands in the said county, you are further authorized and appointed to inquire what other lands in any of the baronies aforesaid are claymed by any English or Protestants, how meared, scituate, and bounded, and in what parishes or places respectively the said lands doe lye, what number of acres such lands so claymed do respectively conteine by estimation, according to the measure of 21 ffoot to the pole, and 160 poles to the acre ; what leases, annuities, rents or other profits are made off, or is issuing or of right ought to issue out of the same to the Commonwealth, in right of any person or persons who have forfeited their interests in the same to the Common-

wealth ; which you are likewise to return in your survey, therein setting down the particular yearly values of every such lease, annuity, rent, or other profit.

Having finished the survey of every the said baronies within the said county, according to the aforementioned rules and instructions given you, you are to cause the same to bee fairly ingrossed in one or more bookes, setting down the survey of each barony by itself, and to return the same, attested under your hands, or the hands of any three or more of you, together with this Commission, and instructions, close sealed up, to the surveyor-generall, and a duplicate thereof, in like manner fairly ingrossed, attested and sealed up, to the register for forfeited lands in Ireland,—at Dublin, together with all records, evidences, and writings which shall come to your hands concerning the premisses or any part of them. In the returne, transcription or making up of which survey, or in any other thing relating to the premisses, you are further to observe such instructions as shall bee sent you by the said commissioners of the Commonwealth, or by the surveyor-generall.

You are to use all expedition in the execution of the aforementioned instructions, that the service of the Commonwealth may not bee retarded thereby ; and for the more effectual performance of the severall duties herein directed, you are hereby authorized to employ such and so many persons under you for writing, ingrossing, and transcribing of such dispositions, surveys, and duplicates, as you are to take and returne by vertue of the above said commission, and to give to each of them such allowance as you shall think fit, provided no unnecessary or immediate charge bee contracted thereby upon the Commonwealth ; and that no one person receive for his paines in writing or transcribing the depositions and surveys as aforesaid above the rate of twenty shillings per week.

Lastly, you are not without speciall lycense or order in writing from the said commissioners to discover to any person the particular values, extent, or the like certainties of the premisses to bee by you surveyed, according to this commission, other than what was before directed to such as shall bee appointed to admeasure any part of the said premisses, nor to keep any coppies of the same with your selves or with any of those that shall bee employed by you.

Notes on the MSS. Materials for the Civil Survey of 1654-56.

(Public Record Office and Quit Rent Office, Ireland).

In the Headfort Collection of Records purchased by the Commissioners of Woods, Forests and Land Revenues of the Crown in 1837 there were several volumes (portion of a complete set) of the Civil Survey made of certain counties of Ireland in the year 1654-5; these volumes were then deposited in their Quit Rent Office, Dublin.

This Quit Rent Office collection of Survey Books included all the barony volumes for the Counties of Donegal, Limerick, Londonderry, Meath, Tipperary, Tyrone, Waterford, Dublin (except Newcastle and Uppercross), Kildare (except Ophaley), and Wexford (except Forth). Detailed lists of these barony volumes are given in a report on the Headfort Collection, printed in the Reports of the Irish Record Commissioners, Vol. II, pp. 21-24.

The Civil Survey was undertaken for seventeen other counties; but it would appear that any Surveys for these counties perished in the fire in the Surveyor-General's Office in 1711. (Essex Street, Dublin).

The Civil Survey consists of Returns of the extent and value of the forfeited lands. It contains very many facts not noted in the particulars and tables accompanying the subsequent mapped Down Survey which was throughout facilitated by the Abstracts made from the Civil Survey.

The Commissioners of Woods, Forests and Land Revenues, at the instance of Mr. J. Harper Scaife, the Superintendent of their Dublin Office, offered this Quit Rent Office Collection of Civil Survey Volumes to the Public Record Office of Ireland, on condition that copies of these Volumes should be prepared in the Public Record Office and furnished to them for constant use in the Quit Rent Office, Dublin.

Mr. James Mills, Deputy Keeper of the Records, gladly accepted the offer. Copies were prepared at the Public Record Office during the years 1900-1910, fresh batches of Civil Survey volumes being deposited there after copies of volumes in the previous batch had been furnished to the Quit Rent Office. By the close of 1910, this work was completed; all the original Civil Survey Books were deposited in the Public Record Office, and copies of them, as stipulated, had been furnished to the Quit Rent Office.

The Quit Rent Office also received a copy of an official copy of the Civil Survey of the barony of Clanmorris, Co. Kerry, presented to the Public Record Office during the above period; the original Survey is not forthcoming.

These volumes were a very important addition to the Records of the Land Settlement under the Commonwealth already in the Public Record Office. They were then available for public inspection, with every facility. They were highly useful as regards local history

and as to certain questions of title. They were specially valuable for topography, the Surveys of some counties being particularly rich in boundary names and place names now often obsolete, or till now unknown.

The principal reason for their transfer was that Records of such value ought to be deposited in the Public Record Office. There they perished in the Summer of 1922.

Happily the Civil survey copies furnished to the Quit Rent Office, and now deposited there, substantially counter-balance that loss ; some of them were compared with the originals by Mr. James Mills, then Deputy-Keeper of the Records, and the remainder by the writer of this Note, then Certifying Officer. All may be accepted as true and authentic copies of the originals destroyed in the year 1922.

MSS. MATERIALS FOR THE CIVIL SURVEY OF 1654-56.

THE CIVIL SURVEY (1654-6) was made for twenty-seven counties and comprehended the whole of Munster, with the exception of county Clare, the whole of Ulster, with the exception of the barony of Farney, county Monaghan, all of Leinster, and part of Connacht, namely, the county of Leitrim. What has survived, so far as can be ascertained, is exhibited in the following statement comprehending the whole or part of eleven counties. To this list is now added the Civil Survey of the barony of Muskerry, Co. Cork and that of Kilkenny city.



That though y^e said Jury were as aforesaid of the most sufficient men wee could inform ourselves of to assist in y^e carrying on of this worke, yet they were not soe wary in that particular as behooved them, fearing (as wee apprehend) that the Contribucon would in some proportion to y^e value then be hereafter charged upon them.

And secondly, wee have viewed severall of y^e said landes and doe finde them to have been worth as valued by us, and soe y^e rest comparatively. All wch our proceedings together with y^e said Comission & Instructions are here humbly returned by

NOTE.—The loss of the Civil Survey text for the two south-western Dublin baronies of Uppercross and Newcastle and Uppercross may, to some extent, be said to be mitigated in so far as copies of the "Books of Reference," directed to be compiled contemporaneously and in conjunction with the Down Survey parish and barony maps (A.D. 1655-56), are available; they furnish descriptions of barony and parish bounds, an account of the nature of the soil, of rivers or other natural features, and of castles, churches, mills, cabins and so on. The descriptive particulars here presented have been taken as already indicated in the Introductory Notes from the "Book of Reference" accompanying the Dublin volume of Down Survey maps kindly loaned to the National Library.

A tabular statement in the "Book of Reference" furnishes an account, parish by parish, of the forfeited lands, the names of the former proprietor, and the acreable extent of each denomination classified as either profitable or unprofitable; details of the names, areas, and boundaries of such lands are usually expressed on the D. S. parish, and, to a lesser extent, on the D. S. barony maps. The particulars given in the "Book of Reference" as to forfeited lands, their acreages and proprietors are also contained in the Book of S. & D., which furnishes the additional information, drawn explicitly from the Civil Survey, as to unforfeited lands; extracts have accordingly been made from the Dublin Book of S. & D. in respect of both the forfeited and unforfeited lands of the two baronies and these form the subject of Appendix B.

On each barony and parish map of this county is recorded the name of the surveyor or surveyors: "The barony of Uppercross in the county of Dublin by Patrick Allen." Though no date appears on any of the maps of either of the two baronies of Uppercross and Newcastle and Uppercross, the year 1655 is recorded on the maps of other territories in the volume; each parish map, to which the following descriptive particulars relate, bears a number which is reproduced here under the name of the surveyor. For the present location of parishes in the "Barony of Uppercross," see Introductory Note to Appendix B.

BARONY OF UPPERCROSS

"THE BARONY OF UPPERCROSS in the County of Dublin Is bounded on the North and West with the Barrony of the Naas in the County of Kildare and in the South and East with the Barrony of Talbotstowne in the County of Wickloe.

"The soyle is generally Arable Meadow Pasture and some Mountain. It contienes these ensuing parishes (viz^t) Ballybought, Tipperkevan and Ballymore

parishes. There runnes through the middest of this Barony the River Lyffy a very considerable River for Salmons. It takes its rise as most doe affirme out of the county of Wickloe and disgorges itself into the Sea ; it comes through the Barrony of Salt and is the meare betweene the Baronney of Newcastle and Castleknock and glides through the Barony* [to the chief] Citty of Ireland called Dublin : there meetes it in the Parish of Ballybough another pleasant River called Ballybought river.

"Over the Lyffey there is built a very faire stone Bridge neare which there stande an old House and Castle called Ballyamore Eustace taken its name from the Proprietor whose name was Eustace. There stood formerly a Mill on this River neare the Bridge ; but it is now out of Repaire. One thing there is very observable that neere the Townland called Silver Hill, this River hath a mighty fall called by the Natives Pullagh Fuckagh. It is reported to be the greatest in Ireland : all along the Bank of this River on Ballyamore side there are abundance of Connyburrroughs which are profitable to the Proprietors.

"There are other Improvements in this Barrony which are fully exprest in the Severall parishes in which they stand."

NOTE.—As explained in the Introduction the Civil Survey of the baronies of Uppercross and of Newcastle and Uppercross—representing the South-western regions of the county, is not available in the Q. R. O. Collection ; the loss however is further mitigated (See App. A.) in so far as a closely contemporaneous record, the Book of Survey and Distribution for Dublin county, is available. Books of S. & D. were directed to be compiled, by the Acts of Settlement & Explanation (14 & 15—17 & 18 Chas. II.), from, *inter alia*, the Civil Survey ; these preserve parish by parish the names of the denominations of land and their proprietors in 1641 ; they also furnish details of the distribution of such lands under the foregoing Acts and of the names of the new proprietors. The extracts relating to the baronies of Uppercross and of Newcastle and Uppercross forming this Appendix have been taken from the Dublin Book of S. & D. formerly in official use in the Q. R. O. With the exception of the letters C. S. indicating the Civil Survey as the source of authority, the letters, numbers, and signs appearing in the first column, are the symbols by which the various lands are indicated on the Down Survey maps. In the last column, the Down Survey admeasurements are given. The captions at the head of the opening columns have been taken from the Book of S. & D. formerly in the Headfort Collection and now in the P.R.O. ; the pagination is that of the text of the Book of S. & D. formerly in official use in the Quit Rent Office.

It may perhaps be stated here by way of guidance that the parishes of Ballymore, Tipperkevin and Ballybought, forming the distinct barony of Uppercross, in the present text, were transferred to the barony of South Naas, Co. Kildare under 6 & 7 Wm. IV., c. 84 ; the parish of Ballybought was subsequently merged in that of Ballymore or Ballymore Eustace ; *cf. Census*, 1871.

The parish of Dunlavin which is included by the Book of S. & D. as within this barony, though not so returned by the "Book of Reference" nor by the Down Survey map of "Uppercross" would appear to be part of the parish of Dunlavin set out in the Wicklow Book of S. & D. as within the barony of

Talbotstown; the "Bishop of Dublin" is returned in the latter volume as the proprietor of the lands there specified, viz.: "Downlavan, Loghmoig, Tornant and Morginstowne." For the modern lands returned in both counties by the Books of S & D, *cf.*, *Census* returns of 1871 for parish of Dunlavin, baronies of Talbotstown Lower and Upper, Co. Wicklow.

Reference should also be made to the Irish Act 26 Geo. 3, c. 14 (A.D. 1786) where the following parishes are, for the purposes of the Act, returned as constituting the barony of Uppercross: Tallaght, Clondalkin, Rathcoole, St. Kevin's without, south side Circular Road, Ballymore Eustace, Milltown Dunlavin, Ballybought, "Tipper Caven," Shankhill, and Dalkey. As to denomination of Shankill, see parish of Rathmichael, barony of Newcastle and Uppercross, in present text; the denomination of "Dawkey" is returned by the Book of S. & D. within the parish of Monkstown, Half barony of Rathdown. By the Act 13 & 14 Geo. III., c. 34, (A.D. 1773-4) "that part of the liberty of St. Sepulchre's to the north of the circular road, including the precincts of the Cathedral Church of St. Patrick's, and the liberty of Donore" were separated from the barony of Uppercross and constituted respectively the barony of St. Sepulchre and the barony of Donore.

Under the Act of 1786 (26 Geo. 3) the following parishes are returned as constituting the barony of Newcastle: Newcastle, Saggart, Kilmatalway, Esker, Rathfarnham, Lucan, Kilmainham, Ballyfarmott, Palmerstown, Cruats [Cruagh] and Crumlin. Some of the foregoing parishes, or parts thereof, were transferred to the reconstituted barony of Uppercross under the provisions of 5 & 6 Vic. c. 96 (1842); instances of such transfers are given in foot-notes.
